

#### **Dear Readers**,

During my time as a contractor and as publisher of *Concrete Decor*, I have weathered three recessions (aka the "R" word) in the United States economy – 1988, 2001 and now. I bring up this distressing topic because I believe that these changes in our economic climate, while unwelcome, are actually healthy for the growing decorative concrete market.

Granted, for some of you, a close friend or family member has already lost their job, their home or even

their good credit history. This letter will do nothing to rectify those unfortunate situations. However, this letter may help by identifying ways to turn this bad time into something good – for the future.

If the economic downturn has depleted your company's cash flow, you need to cut costs. Don't wait for things to come around while the hole you're standing in gets deeper. Doing this means making tough decisions. It may include selling off equipment, cutting staff, or discontinuing services that generally made life at work or at home easier. However, not making these decisions now will likely force us to make them later – at a point in time when it may in fact be too late.

Focus more energy on customer service. This may not seem to be a good anecdote for solving today's cash flow problem, but you may be surprised. Whether it's a customer you did work for a year ago or a month ago, give them a call or stop by and say hello. This may lead to a conversation about your family's summer plans, or lack thereof. It might also lead to a little maintenance work or to a job that keeps your team running for the next couple of months.

Next, learn to relax. Doing so requires the ability to separate the things in life that get you worked up from the things that settle you down. Knowing the differences between these two extremes gives you a better ability to handle each of them independently. You may also consider spending 15 minutes on the livingroom floor each morning doing stretching and cardiovascular exercises. All things considered, look at these potentially slow months as a rest period. When things are again running full steam ahead, rest periods will become a distant memory.

In my opinion, when the good times are rolling along, us humans have a tendency to become complacent and potentially ungrateful for the things we have. However, when hard times hit, we're suddenly forced to slow down or pull to the side of the road in order to get out and find the trouble. In doing so, we not only identify problems, we can fix them and proceed knowing how to better avoid those problems in the future.



#### Decorative Concrete Event declares winners

NW Concrete Design, led by concrete supervisor Scotty Zufelt and


owner Austin Seeley, took third place for a rectangular-patterned slab in several shades of gray.



## **Should You Stop Sealing?**

ately I have been asking myself questions about why we do what we do concerning decorative concrete work. I kind of feel like sealing may be one of those things we do in life because we are told it's what we should do. After all, what reputable concrete contractor would think twice about not sealing, and protecting, their work?

However, is it possible that this necessity is not a necessity at all? Could it be that all the hoopla on sealing concrete is being motivated by glossy pictures causing new contractors to assume this is an industry standard?

The goal of this article is to get you to think about why you do what you do. This article will not be your typical one, outlining what sealer works best on which decorative type, because there are plenty of experts talking about just that. You very well may read this and decide the best method for you is exactly what you are currently doing. I hope this is the case. I also hope you give me a couple of paragraphs to argue my case.

Here is how all this started. Long after office hours one evening, one of my best general contractors that we stamp for was wandering around my outdoor gallery that displays our work. This is a guy who sends many jobs to my company and who is very good to work with for a number of reasons. So of course I opened up the office and we spent the next hour or so answering one question. Why do we seal our stamped concrete?

I felt his question was a little unusual, since this hadn't come up in the thousands of square feet our crew had installed for him. I used a broad brushby, answering his question with the typical fact that sealer brings out vibrant color and protects stains. I could tell by the look on his face he agreed but was looking for something more. I added that the sealer helps keep color from fading and that this is an outdoor investment that should be protected. He was still looking for something more. That's when I said, "Why are you asking?"

His answer is one that you will be hearing if you already haven't — money. He explained how the market was much more competitive and customers were asking why things cost what they do. He also explained that this new market was on a limited budget and that each and every dollar needed to be justified.

This conversation warrants us as decorative specialists to at least weigh the pros and cons of why we seal. To save argument, this pertains to exterior work only. My feeling is that interior work should always be protected and compromise is not an option.

## Here are the arguments to not seal:

**Initial expense:** Using glossy topical-style sealers will increase the job cost for two reasons. First, most highquality sealers will run around \$30 per gallon in material costs. The second reason is the labor to clean the concrete and spray the sealer.

**Long-term expense:** Resealing concrete should take place every two years to five years on most jobs. The cost to reseal runs around 80 cents per square foot depending on the job size.

**Saves time:** Many jobs are tight on time. It is much easier to clean the concrete the next day or two and then invoice the work completed.

**Reduces mineral deposits:** Nothing looks worse than years of sprinkler water leaving calcium and other minerals on the sealer surface. Irrigation will also break down most sealers by turning the surface white and ugly. Under the same conditions, most unsealed concrete will not look as bad.

**Less slipperiness:** Some contractors still haven't figured out that sealer needs nonskid added to it for the protection of customers. This is a nonissue if glossy sealer isn't used.

**Fewer callbacks:** I will assure you that nine out of 10 callbacks to my office are sealer-related. Sealers can and will get squirrelly.

**Fewer job-site visits:** My detail crew is not allowed to seal new concrete for 30 days from last pour. This is a pain, because most customers will use their new concrete before this time. Many days for my detail crew include removing tire marks from driveways and removing patio furniture from outdoor areas.

#### Argument to seal

**Protects:** There is no doubt that sealing concrete protects your client's investment. Tire marks, spills and stains will usually not penetrate the sealed surface. Surface delaminating from freezing may be addressed by sealing. I doubt you would drive a new car off the lot without a protective clear-coat on the painted surface. **Looks attractive:** A good sealer will show the vibrant colors and patterns of most decorative concrete. Most people are attracted to sealed outdoor projects.

**Keeps color from fading:** Sealing concrete is the only way I know to keep color from fading. I cannot tell you how many folks have called over the years asking if we could do something to bring the color back to their jobs.

**Creates business:** Resealing decorative concrete is very profitable and will create another aspect of your business. This also assures your work always looks top-notch and attractive. This helps to keep you connected with your customers.

**Competition separation:** Believe it or not, most decorative contractors do not seal their work. The fact that your business does can be a huge selling point.

**Easier to sell:** A sealed sample will sell many more times than an unsealed

one. There is no doubt that sealed work is more desirable to most people.

**Sells for more:** Sealed concrete will sell for more than unsealed work, even if you factor in the cost of sealer. Most contractors mark up their work, profit and overhead, according to the total job cost.

#### **Final thought**

Whichever you decide, be sure to sell the benefits of your choice. As you can see, there is a good argument for both. My recommendation is to at least protect your work with a penetrating sealer if nothing else. This sealer type is inexpensive but will help protect in a limited fashion. Let me know how it goes.

# Who Stands Behind The Words We Read?

by Peter Wagner, CSI Paper will not refuse ink. What do I mean by that? Well, there is

nothing more important in business than to represent yourself honestly and consistently, and ideally that is how your competition will address itself ... and you. But this doesn't always happen, whether by mistake, through lack of education, or sadly enough, sometimes on purpose.

Too often we take the written word as gospel, but is that truly smart? Do we know what, or who, stands behind the words we read? After all, as Bill Butler, who works with me at L&M Construction Chemicals, will remind you, paper will not refuse ink. Our industry is growing, and as the industry grows, so do the misrepresentations and misunderstandings.

Let's evaluate some of the important foundations behind our industry's growth and strengths as they pertain to LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification, other highperformance building initiatives, and specification writing. As we all learn, some of our misunderstandings are created by what we do or don't include in our specifications.

As a concrete polishing contractor, your sales and marketing are increasingly focused on the requirements of groups, such as USGBC's LEED Program, the Collaborative for High Performance Schools (which began in California but has branched out to an additional seven states), the South Coast Air Quality Management District in Southern California, and the EPA. When an owner, architect/specifier and general contractor look at polished concrete, they are not only looking at performance specifications, they are also looking at installation costs, final appearance, ways to gain financial incentives, and, of course, whether your process is environmentally friendly.

#### **Performance specifications**

What you are selling when you provide polished concrete is a highperformance floor that is functional, can be design-oriented, is sustainable and easily maintained, and delivers the lowest life-cycle cost of any floor coating or covering. But in order to contribute points to a LEED category, the process and product have to meet certain criteria. Criteria promised, but not met, can lead to cost overruns and hurdles to receiving expected credits toward LEED certification. It can also lead you toward losing the job or, at the very least, your reputation. Make sure that your testing methodology is not only the correct one, but that it is run correctly, preferably by an independent third party, such as the CTLGroup. For instance, the correct test for abrasion resistance is ASTM C779/C779M-05 Standard Test Method for Abrasion Resistance of Horizontal Concrete Surfaces. This measurement is the foundation for the strength and

wearability of chemically densified and hardened concrete. Third-party testing and standardization lend to your and the industry's credibility, but even then you need to make sure that you are using the correct test.

#### **Installation costs**

Your costs, and ultimately your customer's costs, are going to vary depending on whether the floor is old or new, how it was finished, whether you have color to add, and when you are allowed to perform your work. Bottom line, your costs are directly related to how educated you and your crew are, and how well you have educated the GC and the owner.

Yours is a business that will fail, or at the least be less profitable, if you live by assumptions. For example, if you assume that the floor is soft when it is in fact hard, you misjudge your labor and tooling costs. Do a test! Are there bond breakers that will require deep cutting to remove, and yet at the same time, the customer wants only to see cream? Find out up front, or at least protect yourself in writing from unknowns ... and do a test. When you write or accept a contract, don't assume that the owner and GC are good guys, and that they will go with the flow when you are behind schedule or parts of the floor "look different" from other parts. Do your best to CYA in writing up front, and if change orders are required that are truly outside your job scope, work your hardest to receive a written change order before moving on. Ask questions up front, listen to the answers, do a test, and then make your bid. Ours is an industry that can be very litigious and unforgiving - protect yourself up front in writing, but in doing so, do it fairly.


#### **Final appearance**

The final appearance of the floor is your finished canvas. Can you go back and fix flaws? Sure, but it's expensive. Be aware of what you promise. Will an acid stain be consistent? No, but does the customer know that? Dyes are monolithic, but just like acid stains, they are transparent. Will every dye application be the same from job to job? No, but do both you and your customer know that? What about patching, edge work and footings? Patching, edge work and footings represent a very small percentage of the job, but they are the most visible objections, ones that can keep you from getting paid. Is it the owner's or GC's fault if you didn't both educate them and protect yourself in writing as to how you would approach those areas? There are jobs where these areas won't be objectionable, but there is a greater percentage of them where they can be your downfall. Address these circumstances up front, show by

example, and get the customer and GC to sign off before you start.

#### **Financial incentives**

Financial incentives go both ways. Looking back at the incentives on a LEED project, the owner who achieves one of the four levels of LEED certification, or meets local CHPS guidelines, can often gain monetary benefits. These benefits can range from quicker regulatory approval to tax rebates or actual payments. In New Hampshire, for example, schools that meet the regional CHPS guidelines can gain an additional 3 percent contribution from the state toward their construction budget. This equates to a 5-10 percent increase in state contributions. For the GC, the opportunity to make a bonus may rest on meeting certain timetables, so if you are one of the subcontractors on the project, you have two reasons to know what you're committing to in writing. First, you need to know that you are capable of meeting the obligations that

your contract calls for. Do you have enough capital to sustain yourself? Are your crews big enough and properly trained? Do you have the proper equipment? If you don't, and yet you committed in writing to being prepared, then you have lied and deserve whatever you get. On the other hand, if you only commit to what you are capable of, and you deliver as promised, then having everything in writing will protect you in your battles with the GC if he falls behind and tries to push you outside the scope of your agreement.

For your continued growth and profitability, make sure that you understand what you read, that what you read is pertinent to your work, and that you yourself can stand behind what you put on paper.

# Putting your work to the test

Know what you are defining with your tests and work descriptions. Your intent is that the architect/owner/GC will be taking you at your word as a professional, an expert.

With ASTM references, the ASTM test speaks for itself, but this does no one any good, and can in fact cause problems, if the proper ASTM is not specified or test results do not follow the prescribed criteria.

For example, with a polished concrete floor that is specified to be densified and hardened, ASTM C779/C779M-05 Standard Test Method for Abrasion Resistance of Horizontal Concrete Surfaces is probably the most important test. This measurement produces the most accurate and true means to judge the impact of the densification. Is such a test practical to administer on every floor, or is every floor the same? No. The fact that there are variations in concrete floors, intended or not, is the reason for using good, sound benchmarks for your testing. Start with a good mix design and finishing technique, such as starting with a 4,000-psi slab that meets ACI 302.1R requirements. By following these industry-approved guidelines, you are showing results based on "an industry-accepted" floor, not a floor that fails to meet standards. If the floor you are densifying is substandard to start with, you and your customer should expect superior results following densification. Your goal should be to provide a minimum increase of abrasion on a "good" floor, with anything above that gravy.

The final step to earning credibility is to have an accredited third party perform the test once the correct test has been identified.

# Public Works Projects: Start Your Bidding

To bid or not to bid? That is the question. And it's one more and more contractors have been asking themselves lately, especially as public works departments are increasingly incorporating decorative concrete into municipal plans. But where does one begin? What's the best approach, and is it the ideal option for everyone? Knowing the rules and the players will help contractors determine if a particular public works project is the right fit.

The City of Virginia Beach, Va., is just one of a number of municipalities that have given decorative concrete facelifts to public areas. At Virginia Beach, a recently installed stormprotection seawall serves a functional purpose and looks attractive while doing so. According to Phill Roehrs, a coastal engineer and head of the city public works department's Surface Water Resource Division, the wall was constructed as part of a federal project, and the city and the Corps of Engineers set aside a percentage of the funding for aesthetic enhancements, including concrete relief, decorative light poles and color schemes. In this case, the artwork was generated and included in the contract, and the successful bidder secured the services of a concrete art molder

Keeping abreast of such projects is as easy as logging onto a computer, Roehrs notes. Like any other public works project in Virginia Beach, the seawall job was listed on the city's Web site, VBgov.com. There, contractors will also find information on all of the projects that are part of the city's sixyear Capital Improvement Program, which is updated annually via a public budget process. Construction contracts are advertised via the local paper and trade listings from the Associated General Contractors of America, McGraw-Hill Construction Dodge Reports and elsewhere. Meanwhile, studies and designs are distributed through a Request For Proposal process, in which consultants interested in doing work for the city register and receive all RFPs as a result. Even the city's purchasing department maintains a form of notification listing similar to the RFP process, Roehrs adds.

Roehrs says that the process by which contractors learn about projects, bid on them, and win the jobs is common. "It's a standard process of sealed bids, sometimes with a prequalification process, all in accordance with the Virginia state procurement code. Basically, track the trade listings or postings by our purchasing department, pull a set of the bid documents for items of interest to the contractor, and follow the bidding instructions."

Contractors in Los Angeles County also don't have to look very hard to find potential public works projects. The County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works even maintains a business

While some of the tips may seem like obvious steps to take — such as reading and filling out all RFPs in their entirety and signing the forms — failing to execute these steps is one of the main reasons contractors are eliminated from the bidding process.

This problem is prevalent, in part, because so many newcomers are entering the public arena, says Gary H. Bozé, a public information officer for the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works. "One major problem for contractors is that a lot of them have done private work and then try to switch over, and it's drastically different. It isn't an easy transition. There's more strict oversight and inspection. There's a much more structured environment. There's more documentation, much of which is required by law. And it takes a while to get established."

What's more, putting together a bid is not easy, Bozé says. "It takes time to review, prepare and submit. And you're not just bidding on one project. You are doing multiple and playing your cards all the time. If you're a small business, the challenge is juggling 20 different things."

And then there's the low-bid scenario. "You're not going to get work just because you have a resume of satisfied customers," Bozé warns. A bid should reflect the cost for the company to construct the project in accordance with the bid documents, plus any overhead and profit. But not everyone bids correctly. If a bid is too low, the agency will question the bid, Bozé says, trying to figure out if the contractor is cutting corners or forgetting something. Ultimately, the contractor may lose out on the job because of an inaccurate low bid. That said, contractors who inadvertently submit an unrealistically low bid are allowed by law to pull the bid without any repercussions.

So what does a contractor need to do to start profiting from the public

sector? First, the law requires all contractors to be bonded. "It's one of the biggest hurdles," Bozé notes.

This bond is a pledge that a contractor will perform as promised and pay bills and payroll on time. The key here, Bozé stresses, is to keep up a good track record and have good cash flow because the better track record you

have, the better bond premium you get.

Once bonded, purchase bid documents early, Bozé says. Having a copy of the bid documents is particularly crucial when there is an amendment because those who have purchased them and who have placed bids will be notified of any changes, he adds. "Even if you are a subcontractor you should know about projects and place bids. Purchase your own bid documents."

Vince Vasconi of AJ Vasconi General Engineering in Concord, Calif., is all too familiar with the bidding process and what it takes to be properly bonded. He's based his last 11 years of business on public works projects. From its inception, AJ Vasconi General Engineering has performed 98 percent of its jobs in the public category, from bridges and retaining walls to a growing niche: skateboard parks. "When (my son Andy and I) first started the business 11 years ago, we immediately felt the competitive nature of public works was conducive to what we wanted to do," Vasconi says. "It's competitive but solid

because if you're the lowest bidder, you're probably going to get the job. In the private sector, they don't have to pick the lowest bidder ... it might be the guy you play golf with."

The most common way to land a public works project may be to submit a bid, but once in a while, a contractor is selected simply on the basis of his or her good work. Shellie Rigsby of Acanthus in the Dallas area was selected as a subcontractor on a few public works projects because the prime contractor who won the bid was familiar with Acanthus's work and approached the company based on its reputation.

Ray Robinson of Robinson Earthscaping in Deadwood, Ore., has also been lucky enough to land a few public works projects simply by virtue of his resume, which includes landscaping the Oregon Coast Aquarium in Newport, Ore., working with Larson Themed Construction on Disney's Animal Kingdom in Orlando, and working on the Museum of Natural and Cultural History at the University of Oregon, in addition to multiple private and residential jobs.

In one instance, the city of Eugene, Ore., Parks and Open Space department contacted Robinson and asked him to create four artistic works as part of a playground project known as RiverPlay. One included miniaturized climbing columns. Another was a 50-foot streambed complete with waterfalls that children can dam using sand. For a project in the city's Willakenzie Park, he created a sandbox complete with a fruit and vegetable theme. As far as Robinson knows, he's the only one in the state creating such projects, a main reason why he was handpicked for the job and paid by the hour. 🛩



# Absolute ConcreteWorks Poulsbo, Wash.

Steve Silberman, president of Absolute ConcreteWorks, Poulsbo, Wash., describes his company's products as "functional art." Principal artisan Tommy Cook's use of color, stain, gleanings from nature and even customers' souvenirs takes the full-service precaster's countertops, fireplaces and sinks to a different plane.

Tommy Cook's professional background was in finish carpentry and other construction trades. But about 10 years ago, his wife asked him to build an indoor fountain. While researching the project, he met a woman who told him her husband was looking for an apprentice to help make concrete countertops, fireplaces and architectural details. Intrigued, he visited the facility and was so taken with the process, he turned his back on carpentry and started learning how to create custom decorative and architectural concrete products.

After about a year, he struck out on his own, setting up shop in a garage with a couple of employees. And he began building a reputation for striking artistic vision combined with excellent craftsmanship.

The business grew, and Cook eventually landed a client who became a partner. Steve Silberman had moved to Washington from California and was in the midst of a



complete renovation of his waterfront home. He and his wife, Tina, wanted something truly distinctive.

Ordinary granite counters just didn't do it for them. Stainless steel wasn't going to fly, either.

Then the contractor suggested they consider Cook's concrete business, and Steve balked — he didn't want a sidewalk in his kitchen! But after visiting the operation, Steve was sold.

Cook designed a backsplash that mimicked the Silbermans' kitchen-window view — the Olympic Mountains, up to the lights of Victoria, Canada.

From that point, the men's relationship

evolved from contractor-and-client to cofounders of Absolute ConcreteWorks.

Cook says the business has enjoyed growth of nearly 300 percent in each of the last three years — a trend the partners believe will continue, even in a softening construction environment, because of the ever-growing visibility and demand for decorative concrete products.

And to accommodate that growth, the company now uses 10,000 square feet of manufacturing space, with another 30,000 square feet outside. Total employment averages about 10 people, and varies according to workload.

A good part of that growth can be

attributed to ACW's focus on customer involvement.

Their clients are encouraged to become actively involved in the process. For example, Silberman says, a client might come to the facility with a contractor or designer in tow, along with a particular color or material sample they want. ACW then sets out to replicate the client's concept in concrete.

For example, the company recently worked on a custom home whose owner loved the look of granite, but wasn't too impressed with the material itself. ACW was able to match the desired appearance by using properly colored post-consumer glass



mixed with crushed mother-of-pearl. (The use of post-consumer or post-commercial glass, metal and other recycled materials is one of ACW's specialties.)

ACW is able to go further than many other companies to accommodate the

design objectives of architects, interior designers and clients. The partners attribute this to a combination of their uncompromising commitment to client service, leading-edge designs, and an ongoing investment in state-of-the-art machinery.

How flexible can they be? ACW has employed everything from coins collected during world travels and Harley-Davidson parts for a motorcycle fan to wild grasses, ferns and leaves culled from an owner's property. "That level of personalization makes us more versatile," Cook says.

Technical proficiency and the proper use of materials — particularly glass-fiber reinforced concrete (GFRC) — enables ACW to pull off some unusual projects.

A recent countertop project was cast in a single piece and carried in by just four people. Not too impressive, you say? Consider this: the slab measured 11 1/2 feet long, 40 inches wide and 2 inches thick, and included a knockout in the center for a cooktop!

In another job, a 14 1/2-foot-tall fireplace was cast in Washington, then shipped to Oregon for installation. Each 3/4inch thick piece was about 6 feet wide and 4 feet high and suffered no cracks, fissures or other problems during transport.

Cook is quick to emphasize that, although these pieces don't weigh as much as "old-school" castings, they are not made from so-called lightweight concrete. "That stuff relies on pumice or foam beads to reduce weight," he says. "But it also reduces the concrete's structural integrity. We just don't do that."

The company is environmentally conscious, too. By relying on alternative (yet equally effective) materials, ACW has reduced its use of portland cement by as much as 50 percent. All of its slurry and rinse water is processed and cleaned. Even leftover concrete is recycled. "We have a line of statuary made from molds I bought years ago," says Cook. "Rather than simply toss our leftovers, we cast it and sell the results."

Although new home construction is waning, ACW doubts that its level of business will decline or level out. "Things are evolving," says Silberman. "Initially, our jobs were remodels or new custom homes and some upper-range spec homes. While the spec homes portion of our business has declined, ACW is called upon for more commercial, retail and condominium projects. Additionally, we are experiencing more calls from higher-end custom homes and remodels, resulting in an overall 31 percent increase in the first quarter of 2008



over the same period in 2007."

The secret? Being able to provide commercial and residential clients with complete precasting services. "We're renowned for our artistic work," Cook says, "but we also produce architectural details — window and door surrounds, wall caps, stair treads. We make concrete masonry units, too."

ACW is poised for even greater growth. Originally, product was mixed in 5-gallon buckets. But the company's continued expansion gave Silberman and Cook the impetus to improve the facility. Today, most products from ACW are fabricated from eco-friendly GFRC under its own SoundCrete brand. "We've invested in state-of-the-art automated equipment from Europe," Silberman says. "We can now mix our materials in 25-gallon batches. Previously, we hand to hand-pack vertical surfaces. Now we're able to spray it, resulting in a more compact product with a tighter matrix and fewer air bubbles."

Cook is confident about ACW's future. As more and more people realize that concrete is an extremely versatile building material — "It's not your father's driveway anymore," he jokes — manufacturers are developing a wider range of sealers, additives, colors and other products.

"There's always something new on the market," Cook says, "and we plan to stay on top of those developments. That's what sets us apart."

# **Reactive Stain on Concrete**

n my opinion, concrete is at its best when it's being concrete, not when it's simulating or mimicking another material. As an ex-employee of L.M. Scofield and Bomanite/QC Construction Products, as a consultant to Brickform and Proline and as the guy who developed the design package that included custom Roman Stone stamps for The Forum Shops at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas, this may seem a bit disingenuous. And yes, it's critical for a contractor in the decorative concrete business to be able to coordinate concrete finish colors and textures with nonconcrete materials. But you'll notice that I say "coordinate," not "simulate."

It's possible for concrete to have stone-like qualities without trying to be stone. It's possible for concrete to be random and variegated like the knots and grain in wood without trying to be that wood. It's possible for concrete to develop a visually active graphic patina like copper without it being, you guessed it, copper.

Here is a staining project featuring relatively honest "sensory concrete" in a semi-themed environment, utilizing some of my favorite techniques: screening to accent highs and lows in the troweled substrate, sporadic rust spotting with Ironite lawn fertilizer, and suggestions of the qualities of stone shelves and strata with application of stains and dyes against torn paper edges.

The venue is a new residential project in progress, in the grassy and oak-forested hills just outside of the Bay area town of Martinez, Calif. After site work was completed, the first order of business was constructing a structure in the style of a grand railroad barn. The structure is partially buried in the side of a hill and includes retaining walls of sculpted concrete as artificial rock. Other walls and ceilings are of unsealed raw lumber. Ceilings are really high and are supported by massive wood beams. The vehicle entry doors are equally massive, made out of wood and custom-wrought, copper-plated steel hardware. When I say massive, I mean that each door weighs in at about 3,000 pounds. The first story of the 3,000-squarefoot-footprint structure was ultimately to function as a project garage, with a mother-in-law unit above. As we arrived, the owners and their kids were living in the second story, while construction continued on the main house.

## The Process: Day 1

#### Produce representative on-site samples

It's important that samples are consistent with and produced with as much care as the project itself. These


samples are not to be reproduced verbatim, but are, instead, to establish a range of acceptable (and desirable) variability. While we're promoting variability, we're very careful with our measuring and record keeping. We keep ourselves well stocked with barium cups, which measure in 1/4-ounce or 1ounce increments, as well as calculators, pencils, pens and notepads. Here we diluted our stains and dyes (Patinaetch stains and Deso Dyes from Colormaker Floors) with a water and acid solution, or water and acetone, as appropriate, to achieve appropriate color saturation levels.

#### Mask adjacent surfaces

We like to use pretaped plastic rolls in disposable applicators. Plastic is applied over an initial strip of blue, stucco or duct tape (as appropriate, depending upon the substrate) and their

taped intersection is taped one more time. You may want to double-mask some especially vulnerable surfaces, such as unsealed raw wood. We remind our client that we will do our best to protect these adjacent surfaces, but that this is not always 100 percent possible. For example, stains or water wicking up unsealed wood is quite likely.

We don't make promises we can't keep to our clients. We keep them informed and let them make choices (especially those that are tricky). Despite what you read in some people's guides, not everything in this business is fail-safe. I don't believe in taking responsibility for things that are impossible to take responsibility for. We've never lost a client on the basis of providing foresight and being honest.

#### Clean and prepare substrate, as appropriate

Our proposals require a dry concrete substrate. It's a good idea to have previously done some kind of a moisture test to check on just how dry things were. We use an electronic hand-held meter and recheck at this point. This may not be the most accurate testing method, but the results are, in any case, instant and relatively close. Our proposals also require that our client provides a cleared, clean, bare substrate, unless otherwise defined, in which case the client pays extra for these services. We won't clear, but if we need to broom or vacuum, we broom or vacuum. If we need to wet-clean, we wet-clean. If we need to degrease, we degrease. We don't spottreat. For consistency, whatever method we're using is applied everywhere. Here, this is followed by screening with a 17-inch floor polisher with a pad driver, a white pad and 80-grit (plus or minus 20 grit) screens. Aesthetically, this screening visually enhances the subtle highs and lows of the original troweling. This really looks great! Simply screening a smooth, or not so smooth, troweled concrete is visually similar to natural honed limestone and brings out the slab's most basic and innate qualities. If dust control is critical, we have vacuums attached to the polisher. Whether a vacuum is attached or not, we follow with a thorough vacuuming. And however we intend to treat the floor, we have also treated the on-site samples the same way. Be sure to pay attention to cleaning joints at this stage as well.

## Day 2

#### Stain and dye concrete

Spray-flash orange-brown acid stain (such as Colormaker's Amber) along torn paper edges. Tear paper in 2-foot to 4-foot lengths for ease of handling. Sometimes flash along a single edge and then ease out. Sometimes flash along a double edge for more defined strata. Step inside or outside the paper, or move to a new location and reflash with a purple brown stain (such as Colormaker's Ebony). Consistently spray the entire floor with a first coat of purple-brown acid stain.

Sporadically apply Ironite lawn fertilizer. This produces interesting rusty spots and is graphically similar to the sporadic negative "wormholes" in natural travertine.



Applying solvent-based acrylic lacquer. Most projects require three sealing coats.

Spray the entire floor with a second coat of orangebrown acid stain. Apply less, then more of this to increase color variability. This second coat will encourage additional "melting" of the fertilizer granules. When the surface is dry, or mostly dry, repeat stain flashing with torn paper edges. The first round of flashing and the second will be either visually softer or crisper, depending upon their order. Respray the entire floor with water, if required, to encourage additional "melting" or a looser, more watery graphic. When dry, or mostly dry, thoroughly rinse using a hose with a trigger nozzle, a 17-inch floor polisher with a soft brush, a doublebladed neoprene squeegee and a wet vacuum. Go home, enjoy a good meal, a glass or two of wine and a good night's sleep. You'll have earned it!

Return the next day, when all is dry, and repeat the process, less the spotting, wetting and rinsing parts, replacing stains with dyes (such as Colormaker's Deso Dyes in combinations that produce orange and purple browns), diluted in either water or acetone. If using acetone, pay particular attention to proper ventilation (acetone is not only flammable, but explosive) and to potential softening and bursting of sprayer hoses. These dyes contribute to interesting controlled spot variegation with overall better field consistency.

The idea here is to create layers of serendipitous variegation that combine to produce a consistent, rich fabric.



# Day 3

# Sealing

When dry (and for The Concretist, this would almost always be the day after staining), seal with approximately three coats of a duller solvent-based acrylic lacquer. If you'd prefer another sealer, be sure that your acid-stain rinsing process was flawless. Solvent sealers are generally more tolerant of some residual salts and acidity. We do a great job of rinsing, but are still leery of other sealers (water-based acrylics, urethanes, epoxies and so on) over acid stains. Now, it's time to demask, demobilize, pick up that big fat check and bask in the adulation.

# **Tournament Players Club Sawgrass Staging Area** Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla.

Ithough most resurfacing jobs are done to cover something up, the concrete staging area at the Tournament Players Club Sawgrass was perfectly serviceable. It wasn't cracked or spalling. It wasn't even particularly ugly. But it was plain, and the TPC Sawgrass golf resort is anything but plain.

The TPC Sawgrass, situated in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., is owned and operated by the PGA Tour, and it is the flagship of the TPC chain of golf resorts. Home to the Players Championship, the highest-paying tournament in golf, the TPC Sawgrass gets a lot of media attention around this time of year. Since the PGA Tour didn't want an expanse of boring gray concrete to mar their flyover shots during the Championship coverage, they went to the Internet — and came up with Craig Heidinger. Heidinger, owner of Concrete Options in Yulee, Fla., had a challenge before him. The space that needed a facelift was the 12,000-square-foot area where the golfers catch a lift out onto the green — a bit like valet parking, only with golf carts. Although the TPC has a pattern of 1-inch pavers that they use throughout the course, they couldn't use them for the pickup area because the pavers wouldn't stand up to the traffic.

Heidinger's job was to give them an overlay that was not only durable, but also matched the paver pattern — and he had a month to do it. So in January, in the weeks leading up to World of Concrete, Heidinger consulted with SureCrete, whose products make up 95 percent of the products he uses, on how they were going to match this pattern.

#### **Time stamps**

David Morris, sales consultant for SureCrete Design Products, tried a

number of stamp manufacturers to see if they'd be willing to make a custom stamp for them, but they dragged their feet. "They were too busy preparing for World of Concrete," he says.

But Julie Ellis, owner of Art Stamped Concrete, was ready to take on the challenge.

Ellis, who has an extensive line of prefab stamps, typically needs four weeks to do the initial design and production work for a custom stamp, followed by a series of proofs and approvals. But the timeline for the TPC




job did not offer her that luxury. "In this industry," says Ellis, "people usually want it done yesterday."

After meeting up with Morris and Heidinger at World of Concrete, Ellis produced, in just three weeks, custom stamping mats that recreated the pattern and texture of the TPC pavers.

So, with a truckful of custom mats

and SureCrete products, Heidinger arrived at the TPC Sawgrass on Feb. 2, ready to give this top-of-the-line golf course a facelift. After filling the expansion joints with epoxy and giving the entire surface a good wash-down with a pressure sprayer, Heidinger was ready for the overlay.

### Laying it down

Heidinger and his crew did the surface 1,000 square feet at a time, with 10 to 12 bags of SureStamp gauge-raked out to 1/4 inch. In an effort to help him with his fast-approaching deadline, SureCrete blended the pigment for the integral color in the bag before shipping, eliminating a step on the job site.

Once the stampable overlay was down, it was time for the really tricky part.

"There's a reason nobody makes a paver stamp pattern," says Heidinger. While Ellis' stamps did their job in replicating the look of the pavers, Heidinger says it was quite a challenge to get the pattern perfectly aligned. It's a very difficult pattern to replicate, he says, requiring a lot of minute adjustments to get the lines aligned and the layout to come out perfectly. Heidinger says he'd definitely use Ellis' custom stamps again, but not for a project like this. "Looking back," he says, "using custom mats for a 12,000square-foot job was not a logical decision."

But despite the challenges of working with an unfamiliar, finicky stamping pattern, the next step of the process produced spectacular results.

# The "Real Magic"

Using SureCrete's water-based EcoStain, Heidinger custom-blended a variety of colors to use as his palette. Applying these in layers, he and his crew painstakingly hand-stained each individual rectangle to achieve the natural, varied look of the original pavers.

"The real magic of the job was [Heidinger's] ability to match the colors," says SureCrete's Morris.

Still, Heidinger was nervous, at first, because no matter how hard they tried, they couldn't get it to look exactly the same as the original. But his fears were soon put to rest.

Once the client saw what it was going to look like, Heidinger says, they loved it. And it's a good thing, too — the coloring process took as long as the rest of the tasks put together.

# The prestige

"I don't think there's a grander job anyone could take than the PGA Tour headquarters," says Heidinger about working for the golf giants. "It's like doing Bill Gates' house."

But there were challenges involved in working for such a high-profile client, as well.

The TPC Sawgrass is not only busy during the Players Championship, but all year round — and no one was about to forgo his or her golf cart pickup just so the concrete could get a makeover. Thus, Heidinger and his crew had a constant audience.

"You do somebody's driveway and a few of the neighbors come have a look," says Heidinger, "but you do the PGA headquarters ..."

Heidinger says that on an average day there would be 200 people "stopping, looking, and gawking." The gawkers were preferable to some of the other guests, who simply walked across

the unfinished surface.

Despite the constant scrutiny, though, Heidinger views the TPC job as a win-win situation. It was certainly a professional coup for him, and the PGA Tour's flagship golf club has an exceptionally photogenic new home for its carts.

# To spray or trowel?

t seems there is only one direction for the decorative concrete industry to go — up. Contractors and designers are finding new opportunities in vertical overlays. "Walls are the next frontier," explains David Landrey, technical director of manufacturer Raeco Specialty Cements. "There is a better chance of a decorative system lasting on a wall. A wall doesn't get traffic, so your artistry doesn't get damaged."

Wayne Sellon, national trainer for Flex-C-Ment, thinks vertical overlays present a growth opportunity. "Construction is feast or famine, but this is different," he says. "We're right at the cutting edge, educating people who don't know it's an option. We're always finding something new to do. Interest in vertical decorative concrete keeps growing and growing and growing and growing."

Why is the market for vertical overlays strong these days? Nathan Giffin, founder of Chicago contracting firm Creative Rock Forming, believes demand is tied to a growing interest in themed environments. "Listening to homeowners and other contractors, they are moving in the direction of artificial environments, competing against cultured stone and rock veneer," he says.

Whatever the reason, good decorative concrete contractors already know some things that are important to success in the vertical market. First on the list is good communication with the customer. "The number one key in construction is communication," explains Wes Vollmer, artisan and founder of Alternative Finishes, based in San Antonio. "Make sure the contractor and the eyes looking at the job are on the same page. If they don't like it, it doesn't matter how well you did it." Samples, mock-ups and sign-offs with designers and owners are as important for vertical applications as they are for floors and patios.

Successful contractors also know the value of training and practice. Vertical overlays present significant value-added opportunities precisely because they are so visible. So contractors looking to move up to vertical overlays take advantage of training offered by manufacturers, suppliers and consultants. Vollmer falls into the latter category. "When I started 15 years ago, no one wanted to help. Everyone had secrets. Now I consult everywhere, even in my own area, to build the industry. A bad job hurts everyone." Giffin is taking training high-tech with a new venture, Vertical Artisans, bringing demonstrations and vertical techniques to the Internet (see sidebar).

### **Spraying vertical overlays**

Part of making a transition from horizontal to vertical concrete work is learning the difference between applying overlays by sprayer and by hand trowel.

Most experts agree that the decision to spray or trowel depends largely on economics. Spraying is a good way to cover large areas in a short amount of time. It's fast and productive. "The advantage of spraying is time," says Vollmer. "You can cover three times the area you can with a hawk and trowel in the same amount of time."

"The thing you are looking for by

spraying is production," Sellon says. "Pumps can make sense in terms of dollars and cents if the job is big enough, say 20,000 square feet."

On the other hand, smaller areas give a contractor some options. "If you are doing, say, a fireplace, you are not going to prep for a sprayer — there's not enough area there to bother," Giffin says.

# **Virtual Vertical**

The ability to communicate with vertical specialists in far-flung places and to stream video of them in action has inspired the creation of a subscription-based online training service.

Vertical Artisans, launched in January 2008 at Verticalartisans. com, presents training videos and articles by experts. The site aims to offer a broader perspective than can be found at schools or training centers that, besides being bound by the limits of time and space, are often devoted to one manufacturer's product line or one artisan's techniques.

Annual subscribers can access the videos at their convenience and review them as often as they like. Vertical Artisans founder Nathan Giffin believes it is unrealistic to expect a contractor to retain what he or she learns in a one-time course, and trial and error on the job hurts the industry. "Instead, let's give them a year to absorb what we teach online," he says. "They can make sample boards, make mistakes, understand there is a learning curve."

The ability to instantly update Web content gives the site an advantage over training DVDs, which are quickly outdated. Online interaction also helps practitioners, some of whom work in Australia, Canada, Spain, South America and China, build productive relationships. Concrete contractors who see new opportunities in vertical decorative work rub virtual shoulders with plasterers, painters and faux finishers who are also looking to expand their offerings.

Subscribers with all levels of expertise can use the site for everything from getting a few tips to learning new methods. Giffin believes that while basic training is abundant, Vertical Artisans meets the need for more training in advanced techniques. The site also offers business and sales advice.

More is on the way. Future plans for the company include hands-on training seminars for subscribers where they can put what they've learned online into practice under the guidance of an experienced artisan. Sheer volume is also not the only economic consideration. "How big of a mess can you get away with making?" Sellon asks. "Pumps are great for new construction because overspray doesn't matter. For an existing building you have to cover the landscaping and carefully mask other areas. I would stay away from spraying in an existing home or building."

Greg Price, director of sales and marketing for FossilCrete, believes that spraying is a good way to break into vertical applications. "Until people used to working on horizontal surfaces can master a technique that defies gravity, they may do better with a pneumatic application, a shotcrete spray rig or regular hopper gun. There are lots of decorative concrete contractors who are extremely talented and skilled, but everything they had done is horizontal. So when they get into vertical, most skilled folks struggle to trowel on vertically. The muscles you use in vertical are quite different than for flatwork. It's a totally different motion - it takes seasoning."

The contour of the underlying surface is also a factor in the decision of whether to spray or trowel, Price adds. For example, FossilCrete makes a logcabin-style foam form. "You would have to hand-trowel all day to get a uniform thickness over a contoured form like this one," he says.

Is spraying less creative? Not necessarily. One technique for vertical finishing is stamping, and in these cases, the stamp allows for creativity. Price cites examples of customers in Hawaii who used native plants, shells, lava and other artifacts to create uniquely textured stamps. Giffin, who specializes in hand-cutting stone-like finishes, says that spraying offers an advantage because it has the capability to put up large amounts of material (4 inches and more) which can then be formed and colored by hand.

Vollmer thinks spraying lends itself to a certain look. "If someone wants on old-world, distressed style, then spray works well. In fact, the more imperfections the better."

Besides masking and cleanup,

spraying presents some equipment challenges. "The initial cost of using spray techniques to enter the vertical market can be high because of the cost of equipment, but it pays off in the long run in terms of productivity," Giffin says.

Sellon sees another downside of spray equipment. "If the pump breaks down, your whole crew is idle," he says. "Pumps are an animal all their own. If the mix is too dry it plugs up. And watch for ambient conditions. If you've got a black hose in the hot sun you've got to keep the pump running or the mix will set up in the hose and you'll have to throw it away. I've used a lot of pumps, and I'm here to tell you I would only spray in a situation where I had enough square footage to make it worthwhile and a big enough crew to keep up with it."

# Troweling


Troweling is where the concrete world meets the plaster world, Landrey says. "Trowel techniques come from the concrete industry and from the plaster industry. Each world has hundreds of years of experience, and it's all converging on the decorative concrete wall. Blades, spatulas, mortarboards — everything's being tried. I mean everything."

This experimentation extends to the variety of possible finished looks. Giffin specializes in creating three-dimensional artificial stone environments. In these cases, he says, vertical overlays have the advantage over stone because they are not limited to preexisting shapes. In fact, he often uses a shovel to apply the mix to the wall and then shapes it by hand.

Vollmer enjoys recreating the look of lath and plaster. He tells the story of overhearing a restaurant owner complain about the look of the painted sheetrock in his establishment's renovation. He wanted to match the existing plaster, but the cost was prohibitive, especially since the sheetrock was already in place. Vollmer volunteered to help. "I went back to my own office, cut a sample out of my own wall, and took it back and everyone bought into it. I matched the real lath and plaster and both were stained with the same acid stain — no one can tell the difference."

Landrey picks up on the plastering theme. He likes the look of a burnished finish where trowel lines are rubbed out with a damp sponge during the first hour after application and the surface is sanded with an orbital or palm sander between one and three hours after final set.

One key advantage of troweling is controllability. "For smaller projects turnaround is faster and cleaner," Giffin says. This is also why Sellon prefers troweling for interior projects, especially in existing buildings. "You have so much

While equipment cost is minimal, the expense of troweling lies in the labor. Because it takes longer to apply vertical overlay materials by hand, that added labor expense must be accounted for. Planning ahead helps keeps estimates accurate and expenses in line. "It all has to do with laying out the job," Sellon says.

#### One or the other — or both

The decision of whether to spray or trowel vertical overlays often boils down to economics. Are there sufficient economies of scale to make the investment in spray equipment and the time spent on masking, preparation and cleanup pay off? The desired finished look is also a major factor.

But vertical overlays don't always require an either-or decision. Where conditions allow, many contractors find that spraying on the initial coat and then troweling on the finish coat or hand-finishing the sprayed-on topcoat bring together the advantages of both systems. Even overlays that are stamped can be improved with hand finishing. "There are more things you can do," Giffin says. "Molds look great, but emphasis on coloring and attention to detail adds realism."

"The object is to make the end project look good and make two people happy — the client and the contractor," Vollmer concludes.



From sprays to penetrating patches to tinted polyurethane cement, engineers continue developing new ways to match colors and speed up repairs of decorative concrete.

There is a wide range of patch and repair products available, from AB epoxies to polymer modified cements. And while technology has done well to address the problems of strength and durability, color matching with polymer stains and dyes remains an imperfect science.

"Color is essential to decorative concrete projects and all repairs rely on a matching or blending color," says Brandon Carpenter, marketing manager for Floric Polytech. "In decorative applications, any patch or repair usually looks like patches or repairs. It is truly an art to be able to masterfully blend in repairs so as not to be noticed."

That art, he says, is at a skill level beyond the ability to apply decorative concrete. Other suppliers agree. "Don't expect an absolutely perfect match, because it just won't happen. You'll drive yourself crazy," says Chris Sullivan, national sales manager for QC Construction Products.

So it is important to make customers aware of the limitations of color matching. That said, there is a wide range of products designed to enable you to get very close.

When decorative concrete contractors think about patches, they are not usually looking for the typical aspects of a concrete or overlay product, Carpenter says.

"The number-one quality desired in patch material is fast drying," he says. "Dry times are essential, especially in commercial settings. Oftentimes you only have from closing one night to opening the next day to have the repair started and finished."

The products cover a wide spectrum of materials. For example, there is a host

of repair mortars available, says Carpenter, typically based on acrylic, latex or styrene-butadiene rubber (SBR) polymer modified cements. Polymers give repair mortars superior compression strength, flexibility, reduced shrinkage and faster dry times.

Kelton Glewwe, vice president of marketing at Roadware Inc., says that applicators also look for a patch product that won't lead to callbacks.

"Contractors are looking for performance and cost effectiveness over the whole job. They want to make a repair one time with a product they are confident will work," he says. "There are many products on the market that fail more often then they work. Contractors are looking for a product that saves them time and makes the end product work better and look better."

Sullivan sees the same trend in his QC Construction Products customers. Specifically, they want a product that becomes part of the substrate, and therefore lasts as long as the substrate. That is particularly important in an exterior application, such as stamped concrete with integral colors. This is where contractors want something that will last the life of the decorative work.

In an interior job that has been stained, color is often more important than strength. Experienced applicators

select mixes that are receptive to stains or dye. For example, Sullivan says, cementitious products with high polymer content resist dye. These high-polymer products grind and polish well, but color must be applied to them as a coating or overlay. It should be noted that engineers at Roadware are working on tinting technology for their polyurethane Mender line.

Some penetrating materials do not require a bonding primer. However Carpenter at Floric Polytech says that with repair mortars, "often it is a good idea to use a bond coat, even with products that typically don't require one."

Here are some specific products available for patching:

### **10 Minute Concrete Mender**

This polyurethane product from Roadware Inc. specializes in fast drying and penetration. Concrete Mender

penetrates concrete surfaces and eliminates bond lines that can fail, says Glewwe. The repair becomes part of the concrete, will not turn brittle like an epoxy, and is more reliable than polyurea.

The key technological characteristic to Concrete Mender's performance is the viscosity. It has a viscosity of less than 8 cps with a surface tension one third that of water. That means that when applied, water beads on the surface, and the product penetrates the substrate. Roadware calls this trademarked process Microdoweling.

Concrete Mender mixes with manufactured sand, which enables it to move with the concrete and accept most coatings. It polishes without melting or clogging diamond pads and blends into



the surrounding finish.

Concrete Mender's advantage over many similar products is its speed. "Concrete Mender can save a contractor a whole day because repair work and decorative treatments can be done on the same shift," Glewwe says. "No more making repairs and coming back the next day to find someone turned on the sprinkler overnight or the local kids messed up all your prep work."

This product does not need a bonding primer. However, it is not the final step. While it can be polished, it cannot take acid stain or dyes. For color, it must be coated after application. Meanwhile, the company's lab is working on a formula that can be tinted to match the color of the substrate.

# **MT-200 Spray-Topping**

Floric Polytech recently introduced MT-200 Spray-Topping. An ultrathin version of Floric's MT-200, it can be applied to stamped concrete by sprayer, providing a new surface while retaining the texture of the previous stamped surface.

Using integral colors in MT-200 Spray-Topping can eliminate colormatching issues when it is used to coat the entire application. MT-200 can also be applied by sprayer or trowel to fill in spots. It is fast-drying, despite a high cement content that makes it harder than typical microtoppings.

# **Crack Repair Kit**

QC Construction Products' Crack Repair Kit is an AB epoxy and repair fabric designed to bridge most nonmoving cracks. It is for use in conjunction with overlayments, such as QC's Thin-Pave NI and Concrete Resurfacer.

The downside of epoxies such as this QC product is they can turn brittle with age compared to polymer cements and are usually not a good choice for exterior work. The upside of QC's system is color-matching. QC offers the same 42-color palette for all of its overlayments. This helps keep color selection consistent across all applications.

# SkimCrete XL

SkimCrete XL is a fast-drying version of Dependable Floor Products' SkimCoat, which has been on the market for more than four decades. A latex-modified cement patch and underlayment, it is designed for a wide range of surfaces — concrete, wood, or adhesive residue — as long as they are interior. The product is most often used to rehab subfloors, as it is formulated to meet the requirements of adhesive manufacturers.

# **Meadow-Patch T1**

This is a one-component, polymer-modified, cementitious repair mortar. Produced by W.R. Meadows, it is designed for maintenance patching and minor repairs.

Thicker than liquid-polymer and epoxy products, it can be used for overhead or vertical applications, and it is suitable for rubber-wheel traffic on floors. Because of its bond and freeze-thaw resistance, Meadow-Patch T1 may be used for interior and exterior applications, above or below grade.

Typical of a mortar, what Meadow-Patch T1 provides in versatility, it loses in speed. It takes two hours to set and one day to cure.

#### CrownWear


Crown Polymers LLC produces its CrownWear line for cold-weather applications and tough environments. The medium-modulus epoxy polymer concrete comes in three different mixes, one that cures in temperatures down to 40 degrees, one that cures as low as 20 degrees, and another that cures underwater. The low-modulus mix cures down to 32 degrees. CrownWear is used for shallow, partial and full-depth patching, wide-void grouting, kerf filling, and vehicular and industrial traffic concrete-surface overlayment.

# Tried and True Color Recipes

#### by Elizabeth Gillette

Decorative concrete enthusiasts have their favorite recipes, just like chefs do, and if you ask, they'll share their secrets with you. *Concrete Decor* did just that recently with several contractors and manufacturers. Here are some of their field-tested favorites.

# **Antiquing a Stamped Overlay**

John Anderson — IdealWork Europe Trevor Foster — Miracote

Antiquing stampable overlays is taken for granted these days. However, there are many ways to achieve this effect. This method is a quick, consistent and effective way to achieve a beautiful antiqued look with Miracote products.

#### **Ingredients:**

Miracote Mirastamp overlay — placed, stamped and cured Miracote Mirastain II Miracote ColorPax-LIP: Sandpiper Beige 2 gallons acetone

### **Directions:**

➡ Mirastain II is a water-andacetone-based penetrating stain that can be mixed with any of the Miracote ColorPax-LIP liquid pigments. Sandpiper Beige was used for this application.

➡ To begin, simply open the concentrated Mirastain II and, using a high-viscosity mixer, start to blend the



stain concentrate. While mixing, add the Sandpiper Beige ColorPax and two gallons of acetone. Mix for 3 minutes, and pour into a solvent-resistant pumpup sprayer.

⇒ Start to spray the Mirastain II in a circular motion about 18 inches above the floor. Because Mirastain II is made with water and acetone, it will settle into the low areas of the texture. It will penetrate deep into the overlay because of the acetone.

⇒ Within a few hours, after the stain has completely dried, you can seal over the Mirastain II, and it will look like a stamped concrete project with powder release.

# **Metallic Without Mud**

Steven Ochs, Southern Arkansas University — Magnolia, Ark. **Ingredients:** 

Smith Paints CT-8 cleaner

Smith Paints Color Floor products: White, Dark Chocolate, Metallic Gold, Silver or Copper Sealer based on application

# **Directions:**

➡ Clean surface with power washer using a zero-degree rotating tip. Apply solution of CT-8, one cup per gallon of water. Scrub with floor machine fitted with either Nylo-Grit or Malish diamond brush. Use 80 grit for most outside broomed finishes.

Allow to set for 15 minutes (do not let solution dry) then power wash. Transfer design to surface, being careful of excess dust created by the drawing material.

➡ Paint in your highlights and shadows using only the White and Dark Chocolate. This technique, known as "Chiaroscuro," was used by Leonardo da Vinci in the 1500s to create the illusion of high relief.

⇒ Roll on thin layers of one of the Smith metallic stains until you achieve the desired effect. Each layer will soften the contrast between the lights and darks as the metallic surface becomes stronger. This enables the metallic to be clean and crisp without being muddied by other pigments. Allow to dry/cure for 24 hours before sealing.



The sealer used on this job was a polyaspartic polyurea from Flexmar with 16 ounces of Arizona Polymer's Resin Sand (40 grit and 60 grit) added per gallon for safety.

# Refurbishing an Existing Interior Slab with Microtopping, Dye, and Sealer

QC Construction Products — Madera, Calif. Ingredients:

- QC Concrete Resurfacer HD base coat: Gray
- QC Concrete Resurfacer HD finish coat: White
- QC Concrete Resurfacer HD mix liquid
- QC Concrete Dye: Warm Honey
- QC Surpro water-based polyurethane matte sealer
- QC Natural Beauty maintenance topcoat finish

# **Directions**

⇒ Surface preparation requires mechanical grinding of the surface to achieve a No. 2 on the ICRI surface profile scale. All surface glue or mastic must be removed so the surface is smooth and free from contamination.

⇒ Mix 2.5 gallons of QC Concrete Resurfacer HD mix liquid and 1 bag of QC concrete resurfacer HD base coat powder in a pail. Mix for 2 minutes or until the material is lump free and has a smooth consistency. Apply the gray QC base coat with a trowel, squeegee or 3/4-inch nap roller. Apply 150 square feet to 200 square feet. Dry for 3 hours. Repeat the gray base coat application process to achieve a final thickness of close to 1/8 inch. Dry for 3 hours.

⇒ Mix 2.5 gallons of QC Concrete Resurfacer HD mix liquid with 1 bag of QC Concrete Resurfacer HD white finish



be used in a water base or solvent base. Dilute the dye with 25 percent acetone or water. Spray the dye with pump or airless sprayer. Dry for 30 minutes. Repeat to achieve the desired final

color intensity. Typically, two coats of QC Concrete Dye are sufficient. Dry for 2 to 4 hours.

⇒ Use a soft broom or vacuum to clean the floor. Mix the entire Surpro WB kit (parts A and B) in a clean plastic mixing container with a mechanical mixer at low speed for 1 minute. Apply the QC Surpro WB with a Padco lightweight spreader at a rate of 300 square feet per gallon. Let dry 4 to 6 hours. Apply a second coat. Dry for 24 hours. Apply QC Natural Beauty with a Padco heavy-weight spreader at a rate of 600 square feet per gallon. Dry for 12 hours. Apply QC Natural Beauty matte finish as needed to maintain the floor.

# **Simple Recipe for Colored Texture**

Proline Stamps — Oceanside, Calif.

This simple recipe uses Proline's Sand Canyon Dura-Color Hardener and their Seamless Designs Carpet Stamp. Two colors of EZ Tique were used to give the finish its mottled look.

#### Ingredients:

Proline Dura-Color Hardener: Sand Canyon Proline Dura-Liquid Release Proline Seamless Designs Carpet Stamp Proline EZ Tique: Mocha and Midnight Gray Proline Dura-Seal high-gloss sealer

#### **Directions:**

⇒ Float the Dura-Color Hardener into the surface of the prepared slab.

Apply the Dura-Liquid Release to the Carpet Stamp and the slab before laying the stamp and tamping it in.

⇒ After the slab has cured, wet it down, and mix EZ Tique with water. You should have one batch of Mocha and one of



Midnight Gray. Starting with the Mocha, apply the EZ Tique with a soft bristle brush over the entire slab. While the first coat is still wet, go back with the Midnight Gray and a small brush. Apply as an accent color in select areas.

⇒ Finally, apply Dura-Seal to finish.

# Super Overlay System

#### Super-Krete — El Cajon, Calif.

Ingredients:
S-12000 Heavy Duty Degreaser
S-1300 Pene-Krete
S-1800/S-1801 Super-Stamp: Gray or White
S-2000 Integral Color
S-9500 Color Stain
S-1710 Liquid Release Agent
Proline Texture Stamp: Random Garden Stone Pattern
S-200 Super-Scrub
Super-Krete sealer of choice
S-16000 Flex Smoother
S-19000 Gauge Rake, set with 1/4-inch Cams



# **Directions:**

All existing concrete surfaces must be structurally sound, solid and completely clean. Remove all sealers, curing compounds, curing agents, dust, dirt, oil and other contaminants that may act as a bond-breaker.

⇒ Mix each bag of Super-Stamp with 4 quarts to 5 quarts of clean water per bag. Additional water may be required in warmer climates to achieve a pancake-batter consistency. Less water may be used in cooler weather or on cold concrete. This system does not require a surface bonding agent.

A Mist the concrete surface with water and, from the wall out, apply Super-Stamp with a gauge rake at a 1/4-inch thickness evenly over the surface at a rate of approximately 25 square feet per bag. Use a Flex Smoother to remove any lines that may appear from the gauge rake application. A light mist

of water on the overlay will assist in finishing. Remember to honor all expansion joints by marking them with a trowel, and clear Super-Stamp out of those areas completely, following the line of the joint from beginning to end.

Allow Super-Stamp to set so that it is pliable, but do not allow Super-Stamp to set completely before the surface is stamped/textured. Overlay is to be pliable, but not sticking to the touch or tools.

⇒ Using a hand-held sprayer, spray Liquid Release Agent onto the stamp tool and onto the surface area to be stamped simultaneously. Do not spray Liquid Release Agent too far ahead as it will evaporate before you are able to get to the area and stamp it.

 $\Rightarrow$  Lay the stamps onto the surface, and either walk or tamp in the impression. Then remove the stamp, move to an unimprinted area and repeat the process until the entire surface has the impression of the stamps. Be sure to lock the stamps tightly together to create your pattern when stamping. Pay attention to the lines, joints and details of the pattern when placing the stamps side by side. Always check the impression before you remove the stamp to ensure the pattern has been fully compressed into Super-Stamp. Allow Super-Stamp to completely dry for at least 24 hours.

 $\Rightarrow$  On the following day, tool out the unclean grout lines, and use a diamond cut blade to open the expansion joints. Sweep or blow off all debris.

⇒ Wet the stamped area with water and clean the entire surface with Super-Scrub using a broom. Rinse surface thoroughly with clean water.

# **Breathing Light Into Your Work**

Steven Ochs, Southern Arkansas University — Magnolia, Ark.

When you have a dark grey slab, you have to take into consideration how that will affect color and its intensity. Most of the colorants on the market differ as much in transparency as concrete differs in color and porosity. Sometimes, you have to keep applying layers to build up the color you want, and by the time you get done, you have lost the interesting characteristics in the concrete.

Here is a method that will give you accuracy among these variables, reduce the amount of product needed, and save you time.

This technique was a favorite of the Flemish painters of the Early Renaissance. They would build up transparent "glazes" of oil paint over wood covered in a white base. Now, as the light strikes the surface, it penetrates through the layers and reflects back.

#### Ingredients:

Smith Paints CT-8 cleaner

Smith Paints Color Floor products: White, Natural (gray) Sealer: based on application.

### **Directions:**

⇒ Clean surface with power washer using a zero-degree rotating tip. Apply solution of CT-8, one cup per gallon of water. Scrub with floor machine fitted with either Nylo-Grit or Malish diamond brush. Use 80 grit for most outside broomed finishes. Allow to set for 15 minutes (do not let solution dry) then power-wash off.



➡ Depending on the base color needed, mix the natural to the white and expect for it to dry two or three shades darker. This will even out flaws, stains and color differences due to different batches. If you really want your colors bright, stain the area with pure white.

As you can tell from the photo, the toes of the claw had a base coat of white beneath the red. This allowed the red to rise up from the dull gray slab without the artisan having to apply multiple layers of stain.

The sealer used on this job was a one-part from Xymax with a nonslip aggregate added for safety.

# **Broom Finish**

#### Super-Krete — El Cajon, Calif.

Broom finishes provide an economical alternative to the removal and replacement of existing concrete. This system creates a flexible and durable finish that can be used to

re-level, renovate, resurface and create decorative patterns and designs, with or without integral coloring. When sealed, the new finish will resist gas, oils, water, salts, freeze-thaw cycles and ultraviolet rays.

#### Ingredients:

S-12000 Heavy Duty Degreaser S-1300 Pene-Krete S-9300/S-9302 Bond-Kote: Gray or White Super-Krete sealer of choice

# **Directions:**

⇒ Surface to be coated should be kept damp with clean water at all times during application of material. Dampen the surface, not allowing water to puddle.

⇒ Prepare a Bond-Kote mixture by adding the desired amount of water to one bag to achieve a flowable, pourable mixture. Mix material well with a jiffy mixer. The actual amount of water needed will vary depending on outside factors such as weather conditions.

⇒ Fill spalls and holes with a dry-slump Bond-Kote mixture, feathering the edges with a trowel and water. Allow the patches to dry. Then, mist the entire surface with water, not allowing it to puddle. Pour the Bond-Kote mixture onto the surface. Apply Bond-Kote at an approximate rate of 300 square feet per bag with a squeegee. Two applications are required.

➡ Apply the second coat of Bond-Kote with a squeegee and follow the squeegee application with a soft-bristled broom, also at 300 square feet per bag, to create a broom finish. Additional coats may be required to achieve the desired finish. Sanding may also be required if ridges are present on the surface to smooth them.

⇒ After applying the final coat of Bond-Kote, always wait 24 hours before applying any other coatings or sealers.

A garage floor is one heck of a challenging place for the beautiful artwork and skillful craftsmanship of a decorative concrete application. Hot tires, oil, battery acid, brake fluid and strong coffee make daily assaults on an applicator's masterpiece.

But the growing market for elaborate decorative floors in commercial and residential garages is a testament to the versatility and durability of decorative concrete. The garage floor is where decorative concrete proves it's more than just a pretty face. These are the types of floors that are meant to stay beautiful in ugly conditions.

Garage floor system suppliers say that when done right, floor maintenance is the easiest job in the garage. Floor system producers say that installers can use maintenance — or the lack of it — as a selling point.

Contractors, for their part, should remind prospective clients that if a deck is installed without professional substrate preparation, or with cheap materials from the local big box store, concrete may be doomed to a short life in the harsh conditions of a garage.

After using all of your prep skills and the right materials, the last step is sharing some cleaning and maintenance tips with the new owner of the floor. There are several manufacturers of one-day systems that offer limited lifetime warranties. Here's a look at long-term care for decorative garage decks.

Mike Meursing is the president of Versatile Building Products, Carson, Calif., which offers the Roll On Rock System 4h. He says that Versatile's epoxy urethane-polyurea hybrid system eliminates substrate contamination or penetrating stains. Maintenance is minimal, he says. "If you use a good system there is no maintenance to be done. That's not an issue with our products."

Most garage floor systems consist of a primer, a base coat and a topcoat made from a UV-resistant material. The various available combinations of epoxies,

polyurethane, polyurea and polyaspartic coatings seal so well that stains and delamination are not generally an issue if the substrate is prepared properly. Color flakes are also safe from stain, and the UV-resistant type will resist fading or yellowing.

Typical stain-makers in a garage are dirt and debris, hot tires, motor oil, grease, fuel, salts, hydraulic fluids, solvents, wiper fluids, spilled paint and tire dressings like Armor All. On an unsealed or uncoated concrete floor, most of these materials will penetrate and leave a stain, and worse, might shorten the life of the surface.

With a properly coated decorative garage floor, all of these materials can be wiped up and cleaned with water. Most manufacturers say that these glossy floors are good for about 10 to 15 years in a high-traffic environment. The surface can be rehabbed with a new topcoat, Meursing says.

Sealing is part of the process, say garage floor system manufacturers such as Patrick Ilfrey, president of Citadel Floor Finishing Systems. Concrete that is not sealed is susceptible to damage and staining. Coated concrete will not deteriorate, he says. "Also, unsightly stains are a thing of the past. Once our coatings cure, they form a completely nonporous surface that oil, salts, gas, spills and bacteria cannot bond to."


While these garage surfaces are tough, there are a few simple practices that customers can employ to extend the life and good looks of those designs that you provided for them.

Ilfrey says that pressure-washing the entire floor once a month could extend the life of the surface layer to 20 years. Spot stains can be addressed with a mild detergent, like Simple Green. Manufacturers such as Franmar Chemical offer soy-based solvents and degreasers. Harsh cleaners — particularly bleach — should not be applied.

Installers can also advise clients that certain materials should be cleaned up immediately, namely brake fluid and battery acid, said Jason Jantzen of Slide-Lok, which offers a color-chip system with a polyaspartic base. These spills will damage the surface of just about anything if left standing long enough.

So to keep your showpiece looking its best for years despite taking the worst, be sure to educate clients on these simple maintenance tips.







### Research examines drop-in anchor failures

Members of the Concrete Sawing & Drilling Association have observed, over the last few years, failures when using half-inch drop-in anchors. Since these failures pose a serious hazard to operators, the CSDA sponsored a senior engineering project at the University of Toledo College of Engineering to evaluate the reasons behind them.

Skip Aston, chair of the CSDA Safety Committee, worked with the students to develop and execute research that would evaluate the performance of half-inch drop-in anchors in core drilling applications. Based on their results, the students discovered important installation parameters when using half-inch drop-in anchors, including: anchors being installed perpendicular to the surface, anchor countersink depth being limited to 1/2 inch, fully set expansion plugs, and threaded rods being fully engaged with the anchor.

## A Concrete Cocktail Table

**T**opCrete Design Studios does a lot of amazing things with concrete. Recently, though, one of their creations itself did something remarkable — it helped fight AIDS.

TopCrete, founded by Daniel Herzner and Vincent Monje, pitched in as a member of the American Society of Interior Designers to help with a charity event that raised money to benefit AIDS research. Its contribution was this Concrete Cocktail Table.

Taking advantage of the opportunity to do a project with no design specs, Herzner and Monje created a complex, custom-blended design using Buddy Rhodes Concrete Counter Mix and Buddy Rhodes' integral Liquid Color. "We eyeballed it," says Herzner, "really had some fun with it."

The lightest shade of blue was created using a very small measure

of the Sky tone of Liquid Color. The slightly darker blue was also Sky, in larger proportions. Finally, the navy blue accents were done using a blend of Sky and Coal. The three different shades of concrete were mixed in separate batches before being scooped into a form.

The mix for the table incorporated FritzPak's Counter-Flo admixture, giving it a slushy consistency. Although TopCrete frequently employs Buddy Rhodes' signature hand-packed technique to place concrete, Herzner used a different approach with this table, taking advantage of the doctored concrete's high flowability. After snapping on a pair of rubber gloves, he created swirls and ripples in the different colors by hand, resulting in a visually striking piece for the charity event. The table went for \$1,200 at auction, all of which was donated to Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS and the International AIDS Vaccine Initiative. Not only is the new owner happy with his table, but Herzner and Monje are, too. "We really love the way it came out," Herzner says.

He and his business partner plan to produce other tables in the same style, but with different color schemes.

Building tables for charity is just one of the many ways that Herzner is involved with decorative concrete. TopCrete fabricates a wide array of custom concrete countertops and interior design elements. Herzner's other company, the DecoCrete Depot, supplies contractors in and around White Plains, N.Y., with specialty decorative concrete tools and materials.


