





Overall, the American Rental Association, through its ARA Rental Market Monitor subscription service, forecasts equipment rental industry total revenue growth of 8.1 percent in 2015 to reach \$38.5 billion in the U.S., including all three segments — construction/industrial, general tool, and party and event.

Construction/industrial rental revenue is now forecast to increase 8.5 percent in 2015 to \$26 billion, with general tool projected to grow 8.3 percent to \$9.9 billion this year, and party and event to show a 4.5 percent increase to \$2.7 billion.

The forecast for Canada calls for 3.7 percent growth in 2015 to \$4.1 billion, with growth of 6.3 percent expected in 2016 to nearly \$4.4 billion.

Giving Back Reaps its Own Rewards

Vore, who started his business 32 years ago, says he's been blessed in growing his company from a one-man operation to a


crew of 18. "One magazine here asked me why I do these ramps and I said, 'Well, I feel like I've been successful in my company. But success

These kids have touched Vore's heart, and he just wants to help them and their families as much as he can. "Some of them are so determined to make life work," he says. "It's just amazing. ASCC's Decorative Concrete Council Names Winners of 2015 Competition **COMING IN MAY/JUNE:**

■ HE winners of the seventh annual Decorative Concrete Awards competition sponsored by the Decorative Concrete Council were recognized in February during a ceremony at World of Concrete in Las Vegas. DCC is a specialty council of the American Society of Concrete Contractors.

At the top of the list, the Doral Park Pavilion by Douglas Wood Associates of Coral Gables, Florida, won the WOW! Award for best overall project, as well as first place in the Concrete Artistry, Under 5,000 Square Feet category. Designed by internationally renowned artist Michelle Oka Doner, the pavilion is made out of self-compacting mix with a 24-inch spread and reinforced concrete strengthened by structural steel spines. Forty percent of the project's cementitious material was replaced with fly ash to help achieve a 56-day design strength. Oka Doner envisioned the 50-foot-long, 25-foot-high structure, located on the outskirts of Miami, to serve as a "feral" gateway to the Everglades nearby.

Other top winners included Concrete Mystique Engraving of Nashville, Tennessee, and T.B. Penick & Sons Inc. of San Diego, California, who each won three decorative concrete awards. In addition to Douglas Wood Associates, six other companies won two awards apiece: Concrete Contractors Interstate of Poway, California; Hyde Concrete of Annapolis, Maryland; Salzano Custom Concrete of Centreville, Virginia; Sundek National Accounts of Arlington, Texas; Shaw & Sons Inc. of Costa Mesa, California; and Trademark Concrete Systems of Anaheim, California.





Website Considerations for the Decorative Concrete Professional

■EBSITES and associated technology have changed the relationships between businesses and customers. Having an attractive, purposeful and

convenient website can make or break a company. A website is particularly useful for a decorative concrete artisan, because it allows you to visually showcase your work,

publish testimonials and be easily found by potential customers.

When confronted by an ugly or hard-touse website, most people will simply move on to the next site. This potential loss of income and business can be avoided. Here, we'll discuss what decorative concrete customers want to see — and how they want to see it to help ensure your website is working for you and not the other way around.


How can customers reach you?

Is your company phone number easily located on your website? Is it large enough to read? You may know exactly where to find your phone number, but first-time visitors to your website may have difficulty. If it can't be located quickly, rethink the location of the phone number. For every second your audience has to spend looking for your contact information, that's a handful of people who will move on to the next business.

Today's technology has a big effect on our phone usage. A phone is not simply for talking anymore. Customers want the ease of email or an easy-to-use contact form. Include these options near your phone number, perhaps all together in a "Contact Us" dropdown box.

Do customers know what you offer?

"We pour concrete" is much different than the services decorative concrete companies actually offer, so don't skimp

on descriptions of what you do. Be specific. Tell them you stamp, stain, color, polish and texture concrete, as well as design outdoor living spaces. Include several pictures with each service because pictures help customers imagine their own home's potential. The phrase "outdoor living spaces" is much less effective than a picture of a beautiful concrete fire pit and patio area with padded concrete seating and an encompassed grill. Show your customers your services. Don't just tell them.

How do customers know you do great work?

There are two main components every contracting service website needs: testimonials and a project portfolio. The best way to earn potential customers' trust is to connect them with former customers and show them actual work you've done.

Be sure when you include testimonials to use only real feedback. Customers can sniff out fake testimonials and it is a sure-fire way to lose business. Testimonials should be current, accurate and descriptive of the service you provided. Ask customers to provide lengthy details about the job and how they felt throughout the experience. Ask specific questions to get the answers you are seeking.

A well-rounded portfolio of your work gives you a unique opportunity to show potential customers what you can do. Not only will this earn you significant trust with regard to your craftsmanship, but customers will see the broad capabilities you have with concrete. Include as many jobs as possible. This is also a great area to utilize search engine optimization. Along with the pictures of each job, describe the techniques you used, the locations of the jobs and any other information that may be useful to drive traffic to your site.

Are you an authority in your field?

Customers want to feel they can trust you. If you don't already have a blog, consider launching one on your website and positioning yourself as an expert on the topic of concrete. You don't want to drown every webpage visitor with the science of concrete, which is why a blog is a great tool. You can organize posts by topic, which allows you to have a section for scientific details such as how concrete cures and another for uncommon uses for decorative concrete.

A blog is a great platform for you to

answer questions as well. It's always a good idea to have an FAQ section on any website. Ask and answer any question you can think of with regard to your particular service, and then answer it in further detail on your blog. For example, "Is decorative concrete slippery?" can be answered with a line about whether or not it is slippery in different applications. Then, you can link your answer to your blog for those who are interested in topical treatments that can make decorative concrete less slippery.

Is your website easy to use?


A slow-loading page, pixelated pictures or glitches in navigation are the fastest ways to lose a modern audience. It is important to spend time upfront to ensure what is called "mobile responsiveness," or a page that loads equally well whether the customer is using a phone, laptop or tablet.

In a world where our attention spans are shrinking and our access to information is growing, having a comprehensive and easy-to-use website is more important than ever. Clear contact information and efficient mobile responsiveness will entice potential customers to stay on your site.

Honest and accurate customer testimonials paired with pictures and descriptions of available services and past jobs will lend customers a sense of security. Artfully chosen pictures do more to encourage customers' creativity than anything else, and including terms chosen for search engine optimization (like those specific services: stained concrete, stamped concrete patios, concrete fire pits, etc.) will drive traffic to your site and expand your audience.

By providing information from all corners of the decorative concrete field and educating readers about decorative concrete processes, you will establish yourself as a trusted authority in the concrete profession. Taking these steps to improve or launch your website could be the difference between a booming business and one that's just struggling to get by.

ARTISAN In concrete





Luisa and Dan Dittmann

Greystone Masonry, Stafford, Virginia

UISA Dittmann says she and her husband, Dan, didn't find decorative concrete, it found them.

Luisa is the senior sales representative and Dan is president at Greystone Masonry, the company they founded 18 years ago. The Dittmanns have enjoyed a high level of success, doing a lot of work for increasingly sophisticated homeowners and for the many government facilities in their region of the country. Much of that success, they say, came from an early opportunity 16 years ago to enter into the decorative concrete fray that they said "yes" to after another contractor said "no."

Turning the negative into a positive

"We do a lot of work for builders and at that time a builder had a customer that wanted stamped concrete," says Luisa, 42. "They approached us, we took a chance and it came out really nice."

Dan, 55, says he's been into concrete and just always liked it. That job 16 years ago was spec'd for stamped concrete, at a time when it was still very new to the market. Dan says he called some local guys and told them he would prep for the work if they would stamp it. They said no. He then said he'd pour it if they didn't have the manpower, but he needed it stamped. They still said no.


"Then I found a couple guys in the phone book and one guy wasn't interested and the other guy didn't have a stamp," says

Dan. "I said, 'How about I get you the stamp?" He said no. Dan found another guy who promised to do the job in a couple of weeks, then he too backed out. "So we did it ourselves," he says. "There was really nobody else that did much of anything decorative until we came along. I guess nobody in the area wanted to do it. We knew it was an up-and-coming thing. We had been to seminars by Increte and Stampcrete and everybody was saying it was on an upward swing. We knew then which way we wanted to take the company."


A concrete direction

Greystone originally did many forms of concrete work, including foundations and walls. The first year after taking the stamping plunge they did half a dozen decorative jobs. By the third year they installed 300 jobs. By the fifth year they had dropped all other business to focus completely on stamping.

Now, aside from their government and commercial work, Greystone specializes in outdoor living spaces. "Patio areas, front entrances, porches, walkways, driveways, decorative seating walls, fireplaces . . . ," says Luisa. "People are taking their indoor living outdoors and they want the same comfort they have inside. The possibilities, the potential, are endless because everybody's backyard is different. Every single day you start with a new canvas and the end result is always very rewarding. It's a very exciting job."

Luisa estimates they install up to 500 projects yearly. However, it often rains and the ground freezes, so that work is squeezed into eight months out of the year. They don't rest on their laurels in the wintertime, though. The Dittmanns also have a snow removal business that generates a lot of calls.

Delivering what customers want

Luisa says a few memorable projects have come about because homeowners kept adding on things they wanted to do. "One started with a pool deck and then the customer decided to do additional seating walls and custom precast steps. Then he added a fireplace and garden walls and a

pavilion," she says of the job that kept them busy for half a year. "He was just so pleased with everything. As we were about to complete something and get out of there he was like, 'What else can I do?"

"...we're like a welloiled machine."

Luisa says their most popular pattern is an Ashlar Slate stamp by Matcrete. "That and flagstone patterns are by far my two most requested patterns," she says.

Dan has overseen large projects for the Marine Corps University, the Officer Candidate School, a mess hall and courtyards at the FBI Academy, including a 10-foot-wide FBI logo. They completed a 20,000-square-foot stamped courtyard for the Fairfax County Public Safety Building. Though these are significant jobs, the Dittmanns are prohibited from photographing much of their work on these projects, because they are in secured government facilities.

Greystone Masonry has a 4,000-squarefoot outdoor showroom with more than 80 varieties of stamps from which to choose. Dan recalls that a high-ranking Marine official visited their showroom to select a stamp. "He wanted a certain stamp with





a certain texture and nobody made that," Dan says, "so we went to Matcrete and had them make a prototype of a Royal Ashlar pattern in a larger size, and we were awarded the contract."

They completed that 20,000-square-foot job in an outdoor area at the Marine Corps University in October 2014 using a color hardener by L. M. Scofield Co. and a clear liquid release. He says it was a challenging job because they could only pour a certain amount at a time and they had to work around a plethora of dowels, expansion joints and control joints.

"We poured over three weeks," he says. "Some of it was traffic rated and needed 18 inches of gravel base on 7 inches of concrete and part of it was just 4 inches of concrete." They used an antiquing agent called EZ-Tique by Proline for a uniform appearance and sealed it with two coats of a Scofield sealer.

Clearly a winner

Greystone Masonry has won many awards and has been featured in many construction magazines. It received 2012 and 2014 ASCC Project Awards firstplace honors along with a first-place 2009 Concrete Pavement Award through Concrete Products magazine.

The company now has 50 employees and four production crews that handle specific

jobs, such as strictly patios or driveways. They have three dedicated crews that only handle power-washing and reseals.

"We have a couple of masonry crews that do the decorative sitting walls and things like that," says Dan. "In our organization everybody has their specialty. A carpenter will be a carpenter and a mason will be a mason. Between our office staff and our talented field crews, we're like a well-oiled machine."

FUNNY thing happened on the way home from the grocery store, says Troy Lemon, president of Cornerstone Decorative Concrete in Holland, Michigan. It all started when he and his 13-year-old son, Josh, stumbled upon an art studio in

their own tiny village of Fennville. Lemon couldn't believe he hadn't noticed it before. But then again, he travels extensively for work, he says, and doesn't often get the chance to enjoy a leisurely visit.

He was amazed by the quality of the local art displayed at Fernwood 1891, owned by local potter Dawn Soltysiak and her physician husband, Rob. "While talking with my now-friend, Jim, who was throwing clay on a wheel while manning the studio, I found out there was a plan to open a coffeehouse in an adjoining space since the former tenant left."

Lemon, who professes he's a people-lover, says he and Jim were talking about concrete, another thing dear to his heart, and the next thing he knows he was sketching a concept on how he could use color to draw people from the entry of the coffeehouse through an opening in the dividing wall and into the art studio next door.

"I am often passionate about my ideas and between that and the fact I'm also an

artisan, I was drawn in quickly," he says. The next day he met with the owners, showed them a color palette and described what he wanted to do, which involved metallics and epoxy, a combination that holds up well to foot traffic. "They got really excited about the concept," he says, and gave him free rein. "I love when people do that."

The project moved very fast, as the carpet glue had already been ground off the floor in prep for paint. Within a week, Lemon was doing the floor, assisted by his son,





Josh, and Lemon's friend Ryan Van Horn, whom he met at the most recent Concrete Decor Show. "He flew out from California to get some experience working with metallics," Lemon says. "He did a really good job. When you do a floor like this, it's at a very fast pace. You need someone to mix, measure and weigh products and bring them to you quickly. Timing is essential."

Together they knocked out a 1,300-square-foot floor in three days using EZChem Inc.'s Metallic Pearl pigments and Key Resin's #511 epoxy in black as a primer under a clear #511 epoxy. "The best part, as always, was making new friends and making art while discovering the wealth of talent in people around me. My sincerest thanks to Rob and Dawn for trusting my vision and providing a canvas," Lemon says.

"Since the floors have been installed our customers have been coming in and saying 'Wow! How did you do these floors? What are they?' I love having the coolest floors in West Michigan," says Dawn.

The new shop, Root Coffeehouse and Café, is slated to open in May. 🥗

Tips from Troy

By Troy Lemon

hen it comes to working with metallics, here are a few ways you can make the job a better experience.

- Portion out the amounts of part A and part B ahead of time, especially when using polyaspartics.
- Label containers of part A and part B and set them in rows so as to not confuse the two.
- Establish a defined mixing area and have one person do all the mixing.
- If the project calls for it, blend measured amounts of pigment and solvent ahead of time.
- Blend metallic pigments thoroughly before mixing the second part of the resin or starting on the floor.
- Use polyaspartics to capture the appearance of different movements in the color.
- Use urethanes to layer colors or change sheens.
- Use stencils to create graphic effects.
- Use restaurant-style red ketchup bottles to disperse resin on a wet floor and create finer lines and veining.
- Try using a non-metallic black in your design to give contrast to the metallics in place and to make them pop.

Overall, be creative, have fun and pray for excellence in all that you do!



A Monumental Effort

Navy Corpsmen Memorial Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, Oceanside, Calif.

OME things get better the second time around.

Take the Navy Corpsmen Memorial at Camp Pendleton in Oceanside, California, for instance. Back in 1983, Raul Avina, an Oceanside resident and local artist who as a young Marine was wounded in the Battle of Iwo Jima during World War II, completed a memorial for the Naval Hospital Camp Pendleton when he was in his 70s. It depicted three Naval corpsmen helping a wounded soldier down the side of a mountain to safety.

That memorial, whose likeness was subsequently incorporated into the hospital's logo, took Avina two years to make in his garage using rebar, concrete and heavy mesh. It stood in front of the hospital for 31 years.

When the time came to replace the aging hospital with a new one, officials planned to relocate the iconic piece but soon discovered it would not survive the move. Some of the original pieces were salvaged and with the aid of photographs, renderings and the old memorial's footprint — not to mention the

rock-solid talent of a decorative concrete artisan — a new sculpture sprang to life. It was rededicated and unveiled Dec. 12, a year after the new hospital opened.

Mounting the challenges

Richard Winget, owner of Authentic Environments USA in Huntington Beach, California, was hired to create the 13 1/2-foot-tall rock for the memorial. Another artisan from Los Angeles was tasked with recasting the figures out of bronze instead of concrete. "Carving the rock around the bronzes proved difficult," Winget says. "Not only were they hot, but reaching some areas was a real problem."

In the process, he says, to make sure "the bronzes looked as if they were climbing down a mountain rather than just floating on it," he and his crew had to move the figures in and out several times. "It was important to me that they look grounded

and we went to great pains to make that happen," he says. "That whole process was actually pretty involved."

Winget built a small model on a 1-inch scale which he says proved useful in helping

him figure out the steel schedule and work out any problems before construction began. For example, he says, "The mountain is a pyramid shape and as the steel began to rise in the air there was a problem with the steel becoming congested at the top. We solved this problem by eliminating bars the higher we got."

Because they were in such close proximity to the ocean, they used specialty materials such as coated rebar and wire, plastic lath and plastic chicken wire. For the structure coat, he used specially designed shotcrete, and for the finish he used a product he makes and markets himself called Carve-Right. "The material had to meet engineered standards," he says. "It was specified by engineers for this project, and I do mean engineers — as in more than one!"


One challenging part of the project was erecting the scaffold in such a way that they could reach everything. "It seemed like the memorial was constantly moving away from us the higher we got," Winget says. They also had to make sure the scaffold was not in the way when the concrete was pneumatically applied.

One of the things that amazed Winget about this job was how many people were involved in this government-sanctioned project. "We had a safety inspector with us at all times and rigging experts on crane days. There were daily scaffolding inspections and general contractor supervisors watching every move we made," he says, not to mention the Navy personnel and other people interested in what they were doing. "The lieutenant general had a privacy fence put up and we then screened our entire scaffold system so no one could see in!"

Protection was also vital to the success of the job, he notes, as they had to work around finished granite slabs and imported Ierusalem stone.

Rock on

Work on the rock portion of the memorial began in October and ended in December. There were many delays due to weather and governmental red tape, Winget says. All told, the project took about eight weeks to complete with as many as five men working at a time.

Improvements to the replacement memorial included making the rock texture look more like that found on Mount Suribachi on the island of Iwo Jima. And unlike the original's white finish, the new rock was colored with an array of topical colors and sealed with an ultraviolet protector to keep the colors from fading.

"We used all types of techniques and tools to bring realism to the rock," says Winget, including brushes, knives and



specialty trowels. He and his crew, which includes his son, Jacob, also made skins from stones that had been imported from Jerusalem for part of the new hospital's facade and used them in combination with their carving process.

"Carving is nothing more than waiting for the right window of opportunity to make the material behave how you want it to," Winget says. "Cracking and breaking is done late in the game, while deep splits are done early while the material is still wet."

This is Winget's first memorial but it will not be his last. "I have plans to do another one in New Jersey to mark the 9-11 disaster," he says.

As for this one, he says he was honored and flattered to be a part of this design/ build project, especially when Dan Avina, son of Raul, who passed away in 2003, shook his hand after the dedication ceremony and thanked him for his fine work. "I wanted his approval," Winget says, explaining that the new memorial includes the original nameplate. "We don't get credit; the original artist does. And that's OK. I just feel privileged to do something for the men and women in the military who have given so much for our country."

Build the Perfect Pool Deck

Part 3 of 3: Finishing the Deck

N part 2 of this 3-part series, we discussed pool copings and the various methods of installation. If you missed part 2, you can find it in the online archives at www. concretedecor.net, Vol. 15 No. 1 January 2015. The article is titled "Build the Perfect Pool Deck."

In this section, we discuss pool deck solutions involving sealers, anti-slip additives and deck drains. In my experience all three of these items are important for your clients' overall satisfaction, as well as the eventual success of your installation.

Salt-water pools

In recent years the popularity of salt-water pools has skyrocketed, because salt water has a softer feel, is gentler on the eyes and skin, is safer than chlorine, needs less maintenance and is lower in cost than chlorine. I chose salt water for my pool and I love it. I occasionally dump in a couple of bags of salt and the water is good for a long time. However, for those of us putting down sealer on concrete decks, salt can be a nightmare. It's common knowledge that salt is one of concrete's worst enemies. You'll need to understand the pros and cons of the different deck sealer options and how effective they are on salt-water pool decks.

There are two basic types of sealers: topical and penetrating. Topical sealers are generally solvent-based acrylic sealers that enhance the color. Most people want topical sealers and they look great at first. Most of these sealers are breathable, which means they let moisture through from underneath, but they also let it come through from the top. If you were to put water on top of these sealers and let it set for an hour before wiping it off, the color would be noticeably darker in that area. Adding salt to the water means you end up with some actually under your sealer. This can contribute to the sealer flaking, especially in high-traffic areas.

Penetrating sealers do not enhance the color of the concrete like topical sealers. They seal the surface from the inside out

and leave no topical film. That means there is nothing that can flake off. Penetrating sealers are far less maintenance and are actually better for the concrete over time. However, most people still want the color enhanced and their concrete to shine.

A third option has been garnering more attention. Many manufacturers have developed a hybrid type of sealer that combines topical and penetrating properties into one product. This type of sealer blocks out water very well. We have tested this numerous times by letting a puddle of water sit overnight on a piece of concrete sealed with this type of sealer. We have seen no

dark spots where the water sat. If water can't get in, the hybrid won't peel off. Hybrids enhance the color but are not as glossy as a straight solvent-based


These hybrids typically have a much lower viscosity that allows for better penetration into the concrete. The drawback is you are again putting a topical film on the surface, so slip-resistance is a concern. In my opinion, if you're going to have any kind of salt on your concrete, whether from pool water or de-icing salts, some type of penetrating sealer should be used. They just protect it better.

Anti-slip additives

Is stamped concrete slippery? That is the question I get most often. The answer is yes, especially where there is constant water, like around a swimming pool. You can buy polypropylene additives that you mix into your sealer that do an OK job. But, around a pool, people want something safer. A 40mesh aluminum oxide works best. However,

it is heavy and doesn't stay suspended in the sealer. You must broadcast it on, which is hard to do by hand, and usually ends up uneven.

We have achieved the best results using a hopper gun, like you would use for spray textures or GFRC (glass fiber reinforced concrete) mixes, to broadcast the aluminum oxide. Have one person spray the sealer and another one very lightly spray the anti-slip out of the hopper gun. Immediately back roll to even it out. This has proven the most effective method I have found to get the right amount of slipresistance. We've never had a callback with this process. The surface feels like 80-grit sandpaper on your feet. You do lose a little shine with this method — a small price to pay if the homeowners don't want people falling down.

Deck drains

What should you do to control rainwater runoff on a pool deck? In a typical scenario the pool company doesn't want the water running back into the pool. The house already has a patio that slopes away from it and will be meeting up to the new pool deck. Many times homes are sited so close together that the water could easily run over to someone else's property.

One option is to place a big, ugly drain for the water, but I've always hated having valleys in the middle of the deck. It certainly doesn't look nice and makes an awkward place to set anything. I always try to slope the concrete all in one plane, then place a streamlined deck drain at the end of the deck.

Typically these drains are only 1 1/2 inches wide by 8 feet long and come in

white, tan or gray. Some customers paint them to match their patio.

In situations where the concrete deck ends into a masonry wall, we glue the drain to the wall then pour against it. If your goal is to avoid dumping excess water on someone else's property, wait until the concrete is poured. Once the concrete has hardened you can glue the drain to the concrete.

The best part about these types of drains is the design. They are flat on one side and round on the other and use standard 1 1/2-inch PVC fittings, pipe and glue. There are also prefabricated corner pieces as well as bottom drain-outs that can be connected to larger underground drain lines. This type of drain system is aesthetically pleasing, will handle a lot of water, is easy to install and is very cost-effective.

These are just a couple of suggestions on how to create the perfect pool deck. The most important thing to remember in all of this is that you have to be able to educate your customer on these things. I deal with hundreds of contractors every year and I cannot begin to tell you how many problems could be avoided by just communicating with your customers. I'd say 95 percent of the time there is no print or specification for the job to be performed. It is your job to communicate these things to your customer so that their expectations are met and everybody's happy. Shoot me an e-mail with your experiences.

Vertical canvases perfect for an endless array of claddings

■HAT's old often becomes new again, and in the case of ICF (insulated concrete forms) construction, many people feel it's not only ready for a rebirth but a healthy adolescence, as well. The construction method first appeared in Europe after World War II, came to North America in the '60s and then faded away in the following decade. While it's always enjoyed a small following, those in the decorative concrete industry see it making a comeback.

They see ICFs as not only a great way to build homes, commercial structures and even decorative walls, but as offering an exterior substrate that's just waiting for vertical concrete products.

A concrete sandwich

Builders using ICF methods already recognize the superiority of concrete. Formally described as "a system of formwork for reinforced concrete made with a rigid thermal insulation," the process can be thought of as a concrete sandwich, with foam serving as the outside bread slices.



The look of this dry-stack installation, above, doesn't give any indication it was poured as panels in a factory.

But we're not talking about just any foam. The forms are interlocking modular units that are dry-stacked — often supported by rebar — then left in place to serve as insulation once the concrete is poured and cured. The most-common materials are polystyrene foam, polyurethane foam, cementbonded wood fiber, cement-bonded polystyrene beads or cellular concrete.

Whatever the choice of modular material, they're all pretty durable, offering better insulation against heat, cold and sound than more conventional construction methods.

They're all pretty receptive to a wide range of coverings, too. Theo Fiorillo of Albuquerque, New Mexico, who frequently serves as a consultant on ICF construction projects, says most people utilizing the construction method don't ask about ICFspecific finishes because ICFs can be finished the same way most other homes can be.

"They each have their own idea about what kind of house they want to live in," he says. "And, an ICF house can be finished any way that any other house can be finished. You can put anything on

it from stone and faux stone to board-andbatten to metal or vinyl siding."

The ability of ICFs to support such a diverse selection of cladding comes from it's flexibility. Fiorillo says he knows of one product where what he calls a "hanging stud" (also referred to as a buck or tie-in) is built into the foam product every 8 inches, specifically to support cladding.

Still another exterior assist is what Fiorillo calls a bridge ledge.

"It's a little triangular outcropping you can use to stack brick or stone on if you want that finish," he says. "Of course, they're using a thin veneer — basically slices of the brick or stone."

Another common look with these structures is stucco, which depending on the product may or may not be applied directly onto the foam.

The Sausalito, California-based ArcusStone Products is a company that manufactures natural limestone plasters which can be applied to an ICF vertical structure, either by spray or trowel, over a base coat. President Carol Kavalaris says ArcusPlaster is a cement-based limestone plaster. The company also has a lime-based product for interiors.

ArcusStone also offers ArcusStonecoat, which is composed primarily of quarried, crushed limestone and natural, integral pigments that have the appearance of natural stone when textured and finished.

The stone can be hand-carved, textured and colored to create a cut-stone look with tight or grouted joints, or even a stacked stone or dry-stack look.

Not only does ArcusStonecoat offer 5,800 psi for impact resistance, it's also versatile enough that Kavalaris says it has found favor on horizontal surfaces, as well.

Something for everyone

ArcusStone certainly isn't the only company offering such a product. Probably the biggest difference between manufacturers is how much prep work is required before the final coat is applied.

For instance the Picayune, Mississippibased Flex-C-Ment offers several different



concrete mixes that adhere to these polystyrene systems.

"We have thin facade materials that can be stamped out and still offer high impressive strengths," says Gregg Hensley, vice president of marketing and sales. "We also have spray textures, micro-toppings and even a full-thickness wall mix that can be stamped to give the depiction of dry-stack or field stone. It can even be hand-carved for people who want to get custom with it."

With any of these products, Hensley says the key to success is surface preparation, and Flex-C-Ment isn't designed to be applied directly to any slick surface — regardless of the bonding agent. Instead, he says it's necessary to rasp or knurl the surface. Another option is the use of a fiberglass mesh product such as SpiderLath, over which a scratch coat is applied.

Hensley says that's particularly important if there are multiple pours of concrete within the forms due to the size or height of the project.

"If the job is done as a continuous pour, you don't have to worry about the expansion and contraction of the ICF forms," he says. "But, if there are cold joints within the pour, you want to have the meshing system to give you added strength for expansion and contraction."

Jim Glessner, owner of the Sparks, Nevada-based GST International, would beg to differ. The producer of a number of coating and sealing formulations, Glessner says his company's Elephant Armor requires nothing by way of a geotextile scratch coat or a scrub coat.

"The problem I see with ICF construction right now is the standard concrete product that is the primary product going over the foam," he says. "A lot of these are acrylic-based mortars and they have very high failure rates. Our product can't fail unless someone drives a tank through it."

Stone veneer panels make ICFs rock

or contractors who want a rock finish on the exterior of an ICF structure, Marc Winkelman and Jim Jenkins, cofounders of CMJ Systems in McMinnville, Oregon, offer a variety of panelized stone veneer systems and interlocking structural insulated home-building panel

"Our panels are revolutionizing the way homes are built and how stone veneer is applied," says Winkelman.

CMJ is casting sheets of veneer stone

in various sizes and seven different styles. To join them to the bucks or tie-ins built into the foam exterior, the sheets are simply attached with screws.

"Typically, a customer will give us the dimensions of the building either by blueprint or by actually measuring the physical structure," Jenkins explains. "Once they give us the dimensions, we custom-cast panel assemblies that interlock and are precisely the sizes needed."



CMJ can cast lightweight sheets of veneer stone in a host of sizes and finishes, including fieldstone (left) and stack stone.

Panel sizes range from 1-by-4 feet up to 12-by-12 feet, but because building sizes are often fluid, Jenkins says it's also possible to cast exacting custom dimensions in the molding process developed by CMJ Systems.

Panels are delivered in sequential order so they can be quickly and easily installed. From the time an order is placed until it shows up at the jobsite on the back of a semi-truck is approximately 30 days.


The look of the finished product varies

"The most popular style is the stacked stone, with a dry-stacked look," Jenkins says. "That's followed in order by limestone panels, river rock, brick and then fieldstone."

Panels are manufactured with preformed conduit through insulation for electrical and plumbing both vertically and horizontally.

Although the stone styles are limited, "We don't have any color charts; we custom color every project," he says.

"The best thing about our design is only 5 percent of the panel actually touches the structure," Jenkins concludes. "In other words, there's an air space that allows for condensation and air flow."



And, because it's sprayed on, Glessner says the amount of square footage that can be covered in a day is head-and-shoulders above those multistep products, which may average out to only 100 to 200 square feet per person per day.

"But, like other products, you can texture it, stamp it, trowel it, roll it or put whatever finish you want on Elephant Armor," he says.

All the advantages

Of course, texture is only one part of a wall system. Uniformly, though, these products seem to offer good color and a long lifecycle.

Emil J. Gera, owner of Emil J. Gera Concrete Contractor Inc. of Weatherly, Pennsylvania, uses Vertical Wall Mix manufactured by Kingdom Products of Throop, Pennsylvania, and he says adding color to a project is no problem.

"You can put an integral color right in the mix to give you a base color if you want," Gera says. "Or, you can leave it the natural gray and highlight the stones to make it look like rocks."

Flex-C-Ment's Hensley says there are multiple ways to attack color with his company's products.

"Most of it is through water-based acrylic sealers and natural pigments," he says. "You can either integrally apply the pigments to create the base color, or you can spray on a topical color that penetrates within the concrete, then come back with a second, third, even fourth color to individualize each stone. Then, you do a final seal of the product."

ArcusStone's Kavalaris agrees with the importance of sealing the project, and says that also helps with its longevity.

"It's certainly easier to apply color as a stain afterwards, then seal it, rather than try to mix the pigments in," she says. "Particularly in climates with a freeze-thaw cycle, it's best to spray a penetrating sealer that's water repellant. But, that's true of any product."

As for durability, Chayse Alejos, technical adviser for GST International, says if the proper steps are followed — in GST's case, a sealer he refers to as "water brush technology" — the project should last a lifetime.

"It will never fail," says Alejos. "It's a permanent fix. Unless you have a 9.0 earthquake or someone drives a tractortrailer into it, it easily has a 100-year lifecycle." So what's the long-term (durable) future

of ICF technology? Gera says he hopes it becomes more of an alternative to people who are looking for energy efficiency, especially as energy costs continue to rise.

Fiorillo, the consultant, agrees. He says it's critical that people recognize the financial savings such construction represents. Also, he says, their ICF projects don't have to look like a high school or municipal building.

"Aesthetically, it can look like any

other project," he notes about the ICF product. "That's one of its beauties. There are no sacrifices, really, and you have the advantages, as well."

Drying Phases of Decorative Sealers:

The Difference Between Drying and Curing

uestion: I recently applied a two-part polyurethane sealer over a stained concrete floor. The sealer's application instructions said to apply the second coat after the sealer was "tack-free" or between 4 and 8 hours after the first coat was applied. What does tack-free mean? Why do I have to wait, and what if I apply the second coat the next day?

Sealers and coatings, for the most part, go through the same phases as they dry and/ or cure. Before explaining these phases, it is important to know that while all sealers and coatings dry, some also cure as they dry.

With the exception of 100 percent solids coatings, sealers and coatings contain liquid solvent called the carrier. Popular solvent carriers include water (yes, water is considered a weak solvent), acetone, xylene, tertiary butyl acetate (known as TBAc), Aromatic 100 and others. Solvents other than water are usually blended together to achieve a desired drying time.

The type and amount of solvent will play a big part in how easily the sealer is applied, how it lies down and how fast or slow it dries. Typically, one-part sealers dry without curing. Once applied to the surface, the liquid carrier evaporates into the air, while the resin or solids portion of the sealer forms a film, allowing the whole system to dry.

With two-part coatings, sometimes referred to as catalyzed systems, drying and curing occur. Curing refers to the chemical reaction that takes place between the different parts mixed together, also commonly called crosslinking. I often compare crosslinking to a bowl of spaghetti with all those intertwined noodles forming a dense network that's not easily pulled apart. Crosslinking is what gives two-part systems added durability and chemical resistance. These are often labeled "high-performance coatings."

Another place where drying versus curing affects our industry is when something is resealed or repaired. Sealers

that dry, and are based on solvents other than water, reliquefy when solvents are applied to them. Coatings that cure are not affected when solvents are applied. This is why one-part, solvent-based sealers — typically acrylics — are easier to repair and recoat without much preparation. Solvents reliquefy the previous layer of sealer, allowing for easy recoat or repair. Water-based sealers or two-part coatings, which do not reliquefy by solvent contact, must be sanded or screened before reapplying or, in a worst-case scenario, removed by a chemical or mechanical process.

Having a basic understanding of drying versus curing makes it easier to explain the different phases sealers and coatings go through.

Phases of sealers and coatings

Shelf Life – This is the length of time a product will last in a container when stored airtight between 50 and 90 degrees Fahrenheit. Most manufacturers offer a one-year shelf life on sealers or coatings. Two-part systems tend to be more sensitive

than one-part systems when it comes to shelf life but, if stored properly, most sealers and coatings will last well past a year.

Pot Life – Also called "working life," this is the phase when the sealer or coating is applied. Once the sealer or coating containers are opened, the required mixing is done and the product is applied. The term comes from the lifespan of the product in the "pot," which is typically a pail or bucket. The length of "pot life" depends on the sealer or coating's chemistry, but it also is affected by the environment, especially temperature. Heat is a catalyst. So the warmer the conditions, the faster the product reacts or dries and the shorter its "pot life."

Open Time – Once the product is applied in a thin layer, it is now "open" to the atmosphere. This phase's length is also greatly affected by the environment (temperature, wind, sun, etc.) as well as the system's chemistry. "Open time" can range from 15 minutes in the case of some polyaspartics to hours when dealing with slow-cure, water-based polyurethanes. Back-

rolling or touch-up work can be performed during the "open time."

Tacky – The sealer or coating enters the drying and/or curing phases, which starts with the "tacky" phase. All application processes should be complete once the product transitions to "tacky." The product shouldn't be touched in this phase. You know the sealer or coating has entered the "tacky" phase when your finger sticks to the film, or you leave a mark that no longer disappears when the sealer or coating film is touched.

Tack Free – This occurs when the product is no longer sticky but is still soft. With two-part coatings, this is the phase when reapplication, known as the recoat window, should take place. The product is hard enough that you can walk on it in socks without leaving a mark, but soft enough that it's still chemically reactive for cohesion between coating layers. If you were to apply the second coat before this phase, you'd risk trapping solvent that is evaporating. You could also damage the surface as it gets tacky.

Dry – This is when the film is no longer soft, and light foot traffic won't damage the surface.

Fully Dry or Cured – The film is fully formed and no longer chemically reactive. The floor is ready for full traffic, finish coats or wax.

To answer the last part of your question, if the recoat window was missed you should apply a second coat after the surface has fully dried. When fully dry, sand the surface lightly with 200+ grit sand paper or screen, then lightly apply the coating.

The important thing to remember is the time it takes for sealers and coatings to go through these phases can vary greatly from product to product and from job to job depending on environmental influences. This means the same product may dry differently depending on where and when it is used, or how it is applied. Consult technical data sheets for the estimated times of the various phases, and always perform a mock-up or sample if in doubt or using a product for the first time.

How Do Successful Contractors Choose the Right Manufacturers?

hoosing the right manufacturer is a dilemma every contractor in our industry faces every day. Before I delve into this topic, let me share a few of my thoughts. I've heard many analogies used to describe the decorative concrete industry over the years, but two comparisons have always resonated the most: "Polished Concrete is part Art and part Construction," and "The polishing industry is still the Wild West."

To me, both of these descriptions are correct. Installing any version of decorative concrete is part art, part construction. The project slab is like a canvas. Sometimes the canvas is beautiful, like most new construction projects, and sometimes the canvas is rough, like many remodeling projects. No matter the canvas, the decorative concrete contractor is tasked with turning it into a piece of art. And this transformation must take place in a construction environment.

The construction environment is like a battlefield every contractor must maneuver on almost every project. You fight debris that gets into your work, navigate damage made by other trades during and after the installation process, and face a multitude of difficulties that can slow you down, necessitate repair work or sometimes destroy your artistic efforts.

In this tumultuous environment, manufacturers or suppliers act as assistants, developers and even lifelines for the project's contractors. In my role as a consultant, I have the privilege to watch the interactions between a host of contractors, subcontractors and manufacturers on many different projects. I believe sharing some of this insight may assist contractors to more efficiently choose manufacturers.

Bank on consistency

There are several factors to consider when choosing a manufacturer to help your company be more successful. Consistency is at the top of this list.

Because I travel a lot and am constantly on the go, I often rely on quick meals, aka fast food. Although I really don't like McDonald's all that much, I've found the food you get from the Golden Arches is consistent all around the world. I go there because I know what I'm getting and can plan appropriately. The same philosophy should be attributable to your selection of manufacturers.

If you get different quality or results across multiple purchases from a manufacturer, more than likely it is caused by a lack of quality control. You may not have the absolute best sealer or diamond tooling on the market, but if you have consistency, then successful, profitable projects and happy customers will follow. Do not be afraid to ask your manufacturers what tolerances and safeguards are built in on any products sold. A good manufacturer will know these answers immediately.

Build strong relationships

When it comes to choosing manufacturers, the second quality to look for is strength of relationship. We are all human. Personal connections are extremely important and are hardwired into our human nature. If a contractor and manufacturer have a great relationship, both sides benefit. Having a specific person who knows you and your business that you can call directly at your manufacturer is a fantastic resource.

As a contractor, there were many times I had to call manufacturers and ask favors on product delivery, information or technical assistance. If the relationships had not been there, the issues would not have been resolved in a timely manner, which would have led to significantly more expenses for me.

My recommendation for the second-most important attribute is to develop strong

relationships. The relationship drives your customer service experience better than any other factor.

Consider price last

The third-most important attribute and I stress "third" — to consider is price. As a contractor, I was always concerned about price, but I quickly figured out good service and product consistency saved me more money over time in reduced labor costs and customer satisfaction. As long as your selected manufacturers are somewhat competitive in the market, the first two attributes are much more important than initially saving a few bucks on the price of chemicals or tooling.

I regularly watch contractors make final decisions on their consumables based on price alone. Many of them end up with extra costs to repair the installation of poor quality products or the use of substandard tooling. I am managing several projects in this situation right now.

Explore the Wild West

At the beginning of this article, I noted that overall the decorative concrete market is like the Wild West. What I meant was that lots of territory is still wide open. Over the years, I've watched a steady stream of new manufacturers compete over the same market segments such as machines or chemicals. Consolidation takes place regularly among the manufacturing players, and sometimes there are major splits and fights behind the scenes. All of this can be pretty scary if you're a contractor trying to get jobs completed, keep guys employed and make a little profit along the way.

With this in mind, I recommend you have at least two good relationships with manufacturers of each of your supply items. It is OK to use more of one than the other based on the factors described earlier, but have a backup plan.

Regularly use your secondary source for a portion of your work. This will allow an additional side benefit of testing products from at least two manufacturers, which will steadily increase your knowledge as well as your productivity. If one manufacturer has a major issue that affects your supply, you can always go to your secondary source without sacrificing the quality of your work or impacting your project schedules.

Choose wisely

The descriptions and recommendations covered in this article are based on my personal experiences and the information gathered from working on a variety of projects with multiple contractors. As an independent consultant, I watch interactions without recommending one manufacturer over another for equal products.

I hope these thoughts help you choose your manufacturers wisely. You will be surprised how much easier your work will be with the right support.

From Line into Shape

There is a famous paperback called "The Elements of Style" by Strunk and White. Many writers treasure it as a guide to writing clearly and succinctly while avoiding common grammatical errors. The handbook itself is a model of clarity.

I had 26 years of studio work and art classes behind me as a fine arts painter when I gave up in disgust at the ploys involved in marketing art. In comparison with the world of galleries and critics, what contractors asked me to produce on floors came as a refreshing whiff of common sense.

Fifteen years later, I decided to teach some principles of design and composition to my contractor-students. Having some knowledge of the way artists think about filling space truly helps in choosing materials and structure. Therefore, I undertake this series of articles to present the Elements of Style for Contractors.

F you take a line and loop it back on itself, you will have a shape. A shape can be twodimensional on a flat surface or threedimensional in sculptural form.

Artists divide possible shapes into two general categories: geometric and organic. Geometric shapes — circles, ovals, squares, triangles — are often used in engineering and construction because they can be easily sketched with a ruler and compass and combined for endless geometric patterns and formats. Organic shapes are most often found in nature (see above). They are often irregular, like the broken slabs along the border of a sulfurous hot spring or the lichen found on some beach pebbles.

If you've ever looked out a plane's window at a river below, you may have noticed how the branching shape of its tributaries on a macro scale mimics the growth pattern of a single leaf's veins on a

micro scale. Scientists are exploring these coincidences and detailing the reasons for them. Their explanation is that no matter their size or scale all growing things are subject to the same physical laws of pressure, packing, stress and flow.

Peter S. Stevens' 1974 book Patterns in Nature is one of my favorites on this topic. Another great source is Nathan Cabot Hale's 1993 book, Abstractions in Art and Nature. In Hales' book, he explains how the shapes in this wood burl grew to closely resemble the flow patterns of moving water.

The grid pattern and symmetry

The most common human-imposed design is the grid. Most city streets are laid out in grids and, because it's so easy to manufacture hundreds of blocks from the same mold, most floors or walls have a grid pattern. Aside from the grid, the most frequent design I see on concrete floors is the "compass rose." This is a rather clumsy design of long, pointed triangles placed four-square within a circle. A current favorite with floor designers, the compass can be plain or elaborate.

Let's take a detour from grids and quadrilateral symmetry and turn to nature for relief from our built environment. In contrast to the rectilinear shapes of the rooms we are hired to enhance, designs inspired by nature can give us variety.



One example is a design done by a Floric Chroma-Tech Stain representative. It is fairly geometric, with its concentric circles and parallel bands, but some wavy riverine forms are woven in and out of the geometry (at varied scale) to lend an element of surprise. This creates the illusion of movement, which a completely symmetrical and centered design, like a compass rose, cannot do. Perfect symmetry appeals to architects and builders, since it feels firm and stable, but artists often shun it because they consider it static.

Balance, emphasis and unity

Rick Lobdell's floor at the DelMonaco Winery & Vineyards in Baxter, Tennessee, featured in the July 2011 issue of Concrete Decor, is another example of fine floor design. Lobdell needed a design that could surround the company logo in the center and cover about 6,500 square feet.

For design inspiration, he says, "I took long walks through the vineyard and analyzed how a vine grows, how it wraps around the trellis, and how large a leaf was in comparison to the size of the vine itself. I created walkways around the main room and through the rest of the building with the trellises." This allowed him to get creative with how the vines, trellises and leaves, which are about 3-by-4 feet in size, interacted with each other.

Trained artists like Lobdell keep some important "principles of good composition" in mind while working out a design. Let's divide this floor in a way that's harmonious, but also has balance, emphasis and unity.

The floor colors are harmonious. The long straight trellises initially look like an ordinary dark border detail, but they are shaped at

intervals to suggest bamboo poles. If Lobdell had used curving vines alone, the design might have looked as if it were wandering off in all directions. The straight trellis provides a stable geometric skeleton, as well as a pleasing contrast with the flowing vine and leaf shapes (that makes for 'emphasis'). The golden edges around each trellis, vine and leaf emphasize each shape and, by being the same width, unify the whole design.

Positive and negative shapes

Artists also are aware of "positive and negative shapes." Positive shapes are usually considered the foreground objects and the space around them is the background, or "negative shapes." Negative shapes are given equal consideration as the shapes formed by the spaces around the positive objects in the foreground.

Try to draw a tree in winter against a snowy background. You'll find it's just as important to get the shapes of the spaces *between* the limbs right as it is to color the branches dark enough to correctly portray width. In fact, by thinking of the tree form as a silhouette and concentrating on the white spaces, you'll draw faster and be more accurate than if you get caught up in drawing the tangle of positive shapes formed by the limbs.

In looking at Lobdell's winery design you can see he didn't try to recreate the actual sizes of a vine and trellis, but simplified and abstracted them. Notice the background spaces between the vine and trellis shapes are in balance with each other, harmonious and varied. The positive and negative shapes work well with each other and the size of the furnishings, so no one part of the room design looks like an afterthought. *That* makes for an effective design!



A Whale's Tale

■ HEREVER you choose to place a bench like this, it's bound to make a splash. Jim Jenkins of CMJ Systems and JPJ Tech Inc. in McMinnville, Oregon, is widely known for his faux rock creations, but his friendship with a marine biologist has cast his net wider.

Jenkins offered a rock bench as a gesture of friendship, but the biologist wouldn't accept it without his wife's approval. Turns out, the wife desired a bench in the shape of a whale's tail. "I'd never heard of a bench made to look like a whale's tail," Jenkins says. "I googled photos of whale's tails and saw a photo that was bench-like in its orientation and replicated it." So far, he has sold 24 through word of mouth alone and is now developing a business plan to provide the benches to art galleries and the retail market of seaside communities along the West Coast.

Jenkins has fine-tuned the creation process. Making one now takes only a fraction of the time it took to make the first six hand-formed benches. Originally, he sculpted the whale's tail with the help of a cardboard-concocted

template. "I covered the cardboard form with the hand-sculpted application of a thin fiber-reinforced cementitious composite," he says. Once the mud dried, Jenkins grinded and polished the bench, which took more than four days. Now that Jenkins has fabricated a mold, he can cast, stain and seal a completed casting in eight hours, tops.

The whale's tail success has given Jenkins the idea of making other animal figurines and sculptures. To go along with one of his recently purchased benches he has been commissioned to create a water feature in the shape of a whale's fin. "I have not had so much fun with a piece in a long, long time," Jenkins says.
